Agreement has been reached to have a former member, Ms. Carol Jones, now School Trustee Elect, join this Committee as a School Board liaison.

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Burnaby can look forward for the next two years with excitement. The skytrain will open. With this as a catalyst, Metrotown will boom, creating construction and staffing jobs in the commercial centres. Burnaby will have a new vitality, a core of commercial activity and identity. A core of commercial activity and identity. The new assessment from Metrotown will provide an additional tax base to our treasury which can be used to reduce taxes or at least assist us in holding the line.

The B.C. Parkway will be continued and expanded along the Skytrain line to provide a linear park trail system for our citizens. Approval has already been given to connect Hall Towers #1 and #2, plus Edmonds House along with the old Highland Park line to Buller Avenue. This will further enhance our linear park at a minimal cost to Burnaby.

Burnaby's Council members will have to address early in 1986 the problems of parking around the Skytrain stations. They will have to look at the possibility of a parking corporation to accommodate park and ride, or look at time limited parking in these areas.

During the election, we expressed our concerns about crime and our neighbourhood environment protection. Next year's Provisional Operating Budget includes an allowance to increase the R.C.M.P. by four (4) Officers in 1986. We will discuss the expansion of the 'Neighbourhood Watch' and similar type protective programs. We will review at a Committee level the new 'Young Offenders' Act'.

Council will continue to pursue the acquisition of the Texaco site at Barnett Marine Park, this to expand the highly used marine park.

During the election, while knocking on doors, it became apparent that there is a need to close our unsightly ditches. I have asked the Manager to review this matter with the Engineering Department with a view to Council adopting a more concentrated program for ditch elimination.

The film industry is alive and well. Twenty-three films are under production in the province, providing the highest level of employment for local film crews in our history. 'The Boy That Could Fly' has just been completed at the Dominion Bridge site. This provided five months of production with \$11,000,000 being spent. Burnaby has rented the Hart Mansion for a filming location for the 'Hitchhiker', a movie series for T.V.

On Friday, November 29th, the Honourable Bob McLelland announced Stage II of the decision making process to find out where the new location for a permanent film industry will be. I am told that the Dominion Bridge site is considered at this time the No. 1 site and we will continue pressing to have it located there.

We are also looking forward to Expo 1986 and its official opening, recognizing that their Royal Highnesses, The Prince and Princess of Wales, will officially open Expo. Because of this, my office has formally invited the royal couple to visit Burnaby during that time. We will be submitting an official program for consideration within the next three weeks and it is our hope that we will receive a visit from the royal couple. Council will also be working with the Expo Committee to assist in an exciting Burnaby program during Expo.

The Burnaby Hospital Foundation is presently on a fund raising drive to raise \$1.9 million for a C.A.T. scanner. I personally realize the worth of this aid to our medical needs and I think it is important that Burnaby Council consider at the time of our annual budget the amount of money that we can grant to this project.

I am pleased to announce the Superintendent Fuchs, the Officer-In-Charge of Burnaby's R.C.M.P. Detachment since June of 1980, was elected this past Thursday to the Presidency of the British Columbia Association of Police Chiefs.

Superintendent Fuchs was the founding Secretary of that body, and is the first R.C.M.P. officer to hold the position of President. On behalf of Council, I would like to offer our congratulations to you, Superintendent, on this honour, and to indicate our support for your efforts.

Ladies and gentlemen, as in the past, Burnaby's Council will serve in a hard working fashion the needs of all of its citizens. I would personally like to thank the co-operation I have had from our staff and the support from our community which showed its confidence in me to serve for a third term. I pledge to you that I will not let you down."
