(a) Ms. Grace Robin, 462 West 17th Avenue, Vancouver, addressed the members of Council on behalf of concerned residents and owners along Sussex Avenue with respect to proposed routing of transit buses to the Metrotown ALRT station. The delegation read from a written brief, the text of which is as follows:

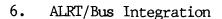
"I am here as a spokesperson on behalf of residents and owners of Sussex Avenue between Imperial and South Beresford. Our concern as we outlined in two previous communications to you is with the proposal contained in the ALRT Bus Integration Plan to route buses along Sussex Avenue north of Imperial to the proposed Metrotown Loop by a special crossing under the ALRT guideway.

We are opposed to the routing of buses along Sussex because it would contribute substantially to the noise and congestion likely to occur when the line and station become operative. This will result in an increase in local private vehicular traffic involving the transport of passengers to and from the station, an increase in parking pressures as well as noise from the trains themselves. We feel that a purely residential street like Sussex north of Imperial should be spared the added burden of traffic involving the Suncrest and Stride buses as well as possibly other buses which may subsequently be added once the underpass route is opened and the principle ceded.

We strongly feel that buses feeding the Metrotown loop should be routed along streets designed for that purpose and that the integrity of purely residential streets and blocks should be retained as much as possible. Imperial, Willingdon and the planned Central Boulevard are streets which carry buses or designed to carry buses and therefore should be used as public transit funnels to the new Metrotown loop. Sussex Avenue north of Imperial is a residential street, was not designed for buses and will be assaulted by considerable noise and congestion coming from private automobile traffic once the Metrotown station is operative. It should not suffer the added burden of noisy bus traffic."

The Acting Municipal Manager submitted a report from the Director Planning and Building Inspection regarding the concept plan for ALRT/bus integration in the context of the 1985/86 Annual Service Plan. A number of changes to the preliminary plans for ALRT/bus integration were recommended as a result of earlier reviews by Council. Although B.C. Transit has recognized municipal concerns, not all changes recommended by Council were incorporated into the revised routing concept. Revised bus/ALRT integration plans would be placed by B.C. Transit staff before the Vancouver Transit Commission at its meeting of 1985 June 14. Accordingly, the staff report identified the municipality's remaining concerns relative to the integration plan.

The Acting Municipal Manager recommended:

- (1) THAT Council approve in principle the proposed B.C. Transit bus/ALRT integration plan subject to the following amendments:
 - a) that the #101 East Burnaby route originating at Lougheed Mall be terminated at the Edmonds station;
 - b) that the #28 Boundary/Smith routing originating at Phibbs exchange be terminated at the Metrotown station.
- (2) THAT Council request B.C. Transit to give further review and consideration to:
 - a) extension of the #41 41st Avenue trolley route originating at UBC to Metrotown;
 - b) implementation of a direct link between SFU and Metrotown station in conjunction with the North Burnaby Area Plan.
- (3) THAT Council's recommendations and a copy of this report be transmitted to B.C. Transit and the Vancouver Transit Commission at Suite 301 700 West Pender Street, Vancouver, B.C., V6C 1G8.
