Madam and Gentlemen:



# Bennett, Harcourt head delegations to Asian countries

VICTORIA — A visit to Expo-85 in Tsukuba, Japan, will highlight Premier Bill Bennett's trip to Korea and Japan next month.

Bennett's office released his itinerary Thursday.

The premier will be accompanied by International Trade Minister Don Phillips, the mayors of Nanaimo, Penticton and Burnaby and 10 business executives on the June 1 to June 17 trip.

Mayor Mike Harcourt, who is also embarking on an economic mission in June, said he was not asked to join the premier. But he added he is not worried that the premier's tour will steal the thunder from his own.

"It's a huge opportunity. There's enough for all of us to do," Harcourt said.

Harcourt's mission, which will include other city officials and businessmen, is to visit Hong Kong, Singapore, Kuala Lumpur and probably Japan and southern China to promote investment in Vancouver and Expo '86.

The premier's delegation will stop over in Tokyo before arriving in Seoul June 3 to meet Canadian ambassador Donald Campbell for a briefing on

Canada-Korea relations.

On June 4 and 5, the delegation is to hold meetings with Korean politicians and businessmen in Seoul, then visit steel plants, steel mills, shipyards and industrial sites before returning to Japan.

On June 14, Bennett is to give the keynote address at a meeting of the Canada Chamber of Commerce in Japan and the Canada-Japan Society.

Joining Bennett and Phillips on the trip will be Burnaby Mayor Bill Lewarne, Penticton Mayor Ivan Messner, Nanaimo Mayor Graeme Roberts, MacMillan Bloedel Ltd. president Ray Smith, Weldwood of Canada Ltd. president Tom Buell, B.C. Resources Investment Corp. president Bruce Howe, who is chairman of the Canada-Korea Business Council, Gulf Canada Resources Inc. president R.H. Carlyle, Cominco Ltd. chairman Norman Anderson, Lornex Mining Corp.
