PRESENTATION

Mr. Elwood N. Veitch, Member of the Legislative Assembly representing the Electoral District of Burnaby Willingdon was invited to address the members of Council on behalf of the Government of the Province of British Columbia.

Mr. Veitch then issued the following statement:

"The Government of British Columbia is always cognizant of the very important role that Burnaby plays in the municipalities of the Lower Mainland. The Government of British Columbia is also fully aware of the municipality's endeavours relative to the upgrading and implementing of the highway related projects within the District of Burnaby. Indeed, the Oakland Avenue, Willingdon Avenue and Sprott Street projects are prime examples of valuable undertakings which are presently under construction as a result of policy decisions by the current Mayor and Council of the District of Burnaby.

Under certain conditions, the Government of British Columbia may share up to 50% of the cost of certain municipal projects. After consultation with the Minister of Municipal Affairs, the Honourable Bill Ritchie, he has acceded to match Burnaby's dollar contribution for the Oakland Avenue, Willingdon Avenue and Sprott Street projects.

It is my pleasure to present a cheque from the Government of British Columbia to the District of Burnaby drawn in the amount of \$857,254.00. In Mr. Ritchie's opinion, and in my opinion as the M.L.A. for Buranby Willingdon, this is a very useful example of municipal cooperation. The citizens of Burnaby will benefit from this type for years to come."

Mr. Veitch then presented the cheque to His Worship, Mayor Lewarne.
