Mrs. Pat Gentile, 7207 Randolph Avenue presented a submission to Council on behalf of residents of the 7200 block Randolph Avenue regarding noise and traffic problems in the vicinity. The submission reads as follows:

"Your Honor and Fellow Alderman:

Good evening, my name is Pat Gentile, and I represent the residents of the 7200 Block of Randolph and Gilley Streets, in Burnaby. We are here to air our complaints about the noise and traffic problems created by Coconuts Night Club. Coconuts is open from 7 pm to 2 am, every day of the week except Sunday. They have a very small parking lot, holding between 40 and 50 cars, and I believe that the club holds about 200 or so patrons. Therefore, the patrons start parking their cars on the street, and they are parking anywhich way - angle, double parallel and also blocking parts of private driveways, also they are parking in the back alleys. They drive over private lawns and shrubs when they are turning around on the street. This has also created a very high noise factor, i.e. - reving their engines, honking horns and racing their cars and trucks up and down the street at all hours of the night. Monday to Wednesday, the street starts to get filled up from 9:30 to 10:00 pm, Thursday to Saturday, the street is filled by 8:00 pm. Since there is always a line up to get in, the patrons are always coming and going, this means the cars are up and down the street, patrons are walking up and down the street, screaming and yelling at each other. They also have been seen urinating on the street and on private property both male and female. When the patrons start leaving Coconuts, which is anywhere from 11:30 pm to 2:30 am, they bring beer bottles and glasses with them, and they proceed to get rowdy on the street, fights break out, language is abusive and foul. The patrons get sick all over everything. There have been a few accidents, where the patrons have hit telephone poles, as they have been drinking excessively. When they leave, they leave behind broken beer bottles, glasses and lots of other litter. We know that the RCMP have been patrolling the street, and we appreciate this, but it seems a lot of the problems go unattended.

Vandalism seems to be staring i.e. - Algo Communications had one of their large spot lights broken - the one on the north side of their building. Travco R.V. Service Centre had two trailer windows smashed and a battery stolen from one of the trailers they were servicing. The people across the street from Coconuts have had windows smashed in cars that have been parked in their driveway. There is a telephone booth across Kingsway from Coconuts that has been broken - apparently the phone booth has been there for five years and never been damaged.

The other night, (a week last Saturday), one resident was awakened at 2:30 am by a knock on the door, as he lives right across from Coconuts, he was apprehensive about answering his door, but when he did, he found no one at the door, but a fight was in progress on the street.

We have some small children on the street, and the parents do not want the children playing outside after 7:00 pm because of all of the additional traffic. Before Coconuts was built, we were a quiet street, even though we are very commercially developed.

Now that the weather has turned warmer, the doors and vents at Coconuts are being opened, making a lot of noise. After 11:00 pm this is making it quite impossible to sleep, also the base noise carries down Randolph and Gilley. The Inter-City Motel, across the street from Coconuts has been having problems with the patrons of Coconuts parking in their motel parking, blocking the driveway and making it very uncomfortable for the motel guests to get any sleep. Many of the guests have indicated that they will not come back to the Inter-City Motel.

We are concerned about the safety on Randolph and Gilley Streets, and I am sure that if fire trucks or emergency vehicles came down these streets, they would find it rather difficult to get down, with the way the patrons of Coconuts have parked all over the street.

The Liquor Control Board has been contacted, but they say the onus is on the Municipality - Re: the number of people in the club at one time.

A survey was never taken in repsect of us wanting or not wanting a night club.

Letters have been written to the Municipality in the past about our problems, one letter in particular was sent January 10th, 1985 and the reply by Mayor Lewarne, indicated that the Municipality was aware of the problems, but as of yet, no action has been taken that we know of.

As this is a community problem, and you are representatives of the community, we are turning to you for guidelines, and what are our rights as taxpayers. How is it that one business is able to profit at the expense of others.

Thank you (Signed by Pat Gentile and fourteen other signatories)"

(b) Mr. George Steinmann, 4206 Union Street then addressed the members of Council with respect to stop signs at Gilmore Avenue and Union Street. The delegation reviewed actions taken by the Engineering Department subsequent to his previous appearance as a delegation to Council on 1985 January 14 at which meeting Council adopted a Traffic Safety Committee recommendation to convert the subject intersection to a two-way stop, with stop signs on Union Street. The delegation expressed dissatisfaction with the stop sign conversion and urged that it be returned to a four-way stop intersection. A petition containing 1,014 signatures in support of this request was submitted to Council for consideration. The text of the petition is contained hereunder:

"The people of this area would like the four way stop signs back at Gilmore and Union. Since the stop signs have been gone, people complain about the safety for their children. There are many schools around the area and it is hard for kids to cross the street, to go home, or to the corner store located at Gilmore and Union Street. It is even hard for drivers who turn on Union Street to get to Gilmore Avenue. So we want the stop signs back for our safety (please see bottom) (1,014 signatures)."
