- (a) Mrs. Irene Frith, 4971 Tilton Road, Richmond, then addressed the Meeting as Council's representative on the North Fraser Harbour Commission. The delegation advised that the Commission proposed to salute the City of Vancouver's 100th birthday by way of a 'Workboat Parade' during Marine Week of Expo '86, 1986 July 27. The Commission extended an invitation to community organizations in Burnaby to participate in functions along the parade route and to assist in stimulating community awareness of the event. The Commission particularly wished to stress the effects of the North Fraser on the economy of the adjacent municipalities in addition to the well known recreational values. The delegation further advised that the event has received the official sanction from Expo '86 as part of Marine Week and the Parks and Recreation Commission would also be approached for support of the proposals.
- (b) Reverend Charles Lenz, 4550 Kitchener Street, addressed the members of Council with respect to proposed Local Improvements in the 4500 block Kitchener Street. The delegation suggested that information provided by municipal staff had influenced the manner in which the Wardens of the Church had proceeded to obtain signatures for a petition opposing the proposed works. It was understood by the Church Wardens that four signatures would be sufficient to defeat the proposed works and, as owners of three separate parcels, the Church would be entitled to three votes in the matter. Therefore, only one other signature in opposition had been sought. The delegation then requested that Council authorize reopening of the petitioning process in order for the Church to fully canvass the abutting owners.

The Municipal Manager submitted a report from the Municipal Clerk with respect to Project No. 85-050 of the 1985 Local Improvement Program. The report sets out details and background information respecting staff's determination that the petition of The Parish of Christ the King Church was not sufficient to defeat the proposed works. The report provides details of ownership of the affected properties and concludes with advice that the Municipal Clerk is unable to certify the petition in question as being sufficient to defeat the project.

(c) Mr. Brian Prentice, 4386 Portland Street, addressed the members of Council on behalf of residents of the 4100 and 4300 blocks Portland Street and residents of Sussex Avenue between Rumble and Portland. The delegation advised that the majority of residents in the aforementioned area were opposed to the rerouting of bus No. 116 along Portland Street and, furthermore, criticized Council's approval of the new route without consultation with the affected residents.

The delegation then listed the following points of concern to the area residents:

- 1. B.C. Transit claimed the route will serve approximately 200 new riders a petition circulated among area residents suggests 85% are opposed to the route change;
- 2. B.C. Transit and the municipality claim a large senior citizen population will be served only 16 senior citizens were found to live in the subject area during a recent survey (the Fairhaven Home is an exception since it has its own bus service);
- 3. B.C. Transit is concerned about the grade on Sussex Avenue, south of Portland Street the residents claim that the total grade is the same and therefore a change is unnecessary;
- 4. Route No. 116 was approved by Council in 1985 May the delegation had been unable to find mention of the change in the Municipal Manager's Reports for the subject;
- 5. The street width is 28 feet residents currently park their cars on both sides of the street and are concerned that a parking ban will be necessary to allow passage of buses;
- 6. B.C. Transit claim improved bus service to the Metrotown Centre and A.L.R.T. Station will result from the change local residents would first be required to travel down to Marine Drive where the bus often waits for periods of up to 10 minutes;
- 7. Safety aspects the delegation advised that 25 school children live along the subject section of Portland Street and either walk or cycle to school and might be placed at risk in encountering heavy bus traffic;
- 8. Municipal taxes the delegation suggested the route change would necessitate local improvements and area residents would be required to contribute to the cost of upgrading the street to the necessary standards.

Finally, the delegation urged Council to reconsider its earlier approval of route No. 116 or, alternatively, leave the route as it presently exists.

Mr. Norton advised that the citizens were opposed to local improvements on the grounds that increased municipal taxes would present hardship and, in one instance, possible relocation of a bus stop would block access to a home. The delegation requested that Council not proceed with the proposed local improvement.

The delegation then advised that the study, which was completed in 1985 October, suggests the appropriate designation would be for three storey apartment. The delegation then summarized reasons for supporting the mixed use proposal. Council was urged to move ahead with the proposed rezoning and suggested that any further delay would be financially intolerable for his client.

(e) Province of British Columbia, Ministry of Human Resources, Minister, 1985 November 19, Re: Commuter Rail
