SIGN AT PATTERSON AVENUE AND HURST STREET

RECOMMENDATIONS:

1. THAT the existing sign on Patterson Avenue at Hurst Street be relocated to the centre median of the Willingdon Avenue extension north of Imperial Street.
2. THAT a sign be posted adjacent the south curb of Imperial Street about 70 feet west of Patterson Avenue giving direction to Willingdon Avenue south.
3. THAT K. I. Durk, 7008 Patterson Avenue, Burnaby, B. C., V5J 3H7 be sent a copy of this report.
4. THAT C. W. Bressler, 6909 Willingdon Avenue, Burnaby, B. C., V5J 3R3 be sent a copy of this report.

R E P O R T

The subject sign was installed in 1985 in response to a request from a Mr. C. W. Bressler, 6909 Willingdon Avenue. This was covered as Item #3, Manager's Report No. 39, Council meeting 1985 June 03 (copy attached).

On the attached Sketch we have indicated its current location. In an attempt to resolve the concerns of Mr. Durk, we propose to move the sign to the north side of Imperial Street and place it on the Willingdon Avenue centre median. We contacted Mr. Durk by telephone and he was in agreement with our proposed relocation of the subject sign.

Inasmuch as the sign was originally installed at the request of Mr. Bressler, we telephoned him to advise him of our proposal. His first reaction was to disagree because he claimed his original problem was a visitor eastbound on Imperial Street having problems locating his home on Willingdon Avenue. He claimed the street name sign on the signal davit on the north side of Imperial Street, which reads Willingdon Ext. (extension), is confusing. We pointed out that the signal davit on the south side of Imperial Street has a street name sign reading Patterson Avenue. Mr. Bressler insists that the eastbound motorist will read and be directed by the closest sign, which is the one on the north side. While we could not fully agree with him, we advised him that we would be prepared

to place a sign adjacent to the curb lane of Imperial Street about 70 feet west of Patterson Avenue indicating Willingdon Avenue south is located one block further east; this sign should be clear to any vehicle in the curb lane wishing to turn right and that driver can then proceed another block to gain access to Willingdon Avenue south. Mr. Bressler, although not fully convinced, will observe the results of the change and advise us if the former problem still persists.

RECOMMENDATION:

THAT Mr. C.W. Bressler, 6909 Willingdon Avenue, Burnaby, B.C., V5J 3R3, receive a copy of this report.

REPORT:

Reference the submission from C.W. Bressler, 6909 Willingdon Avenue, Burnaby, B.C., V5J 3R3.

The intersection of Imperial/Patterson/Willingdon Extension has been signed over each leg with oversized street name signs suspended on the signal arms. These signs are printed on both sides and therefore can be read from any approach direction. However, because of the street layout which is indicated on the attached sketch, it is possible that someone looking for the 6900 block Willingdon Avenue could have difficulty. If they drive north on the Willingdon Extension they will come to the signed intersection of Willingdon Avenue where it connects to Willingdon Extension. If they drive south on Patterson Avenue they must turn left for one block. To assist the stranger to the area we will post a directional sign at Patterson Avenue and Hurst Street as indicated on the sketch. This was discussed with Mr. Bressler who indicated that he was satisfied with the action being taken.

Push button signs for the signalized intersection of Imperial and Patterson Avenue are on order and should be in place within a week.
