At this point, His Worship, Mayor Lewarne, invited the Director Engineering, Mr. E.E. Olson, to provide the meeting with an update on the status of the #101 bus route. The Director Engineering then advised the meeting that B.C. Transit had informed staff that new bus route changes are implemented only once per month and it was proposed to install the new bus stop posts associated with route #101 for implementation on 1986 May 30.

- (a) Mr. L. Leslie Giles, 8118 Twelfth Avenue, then addressed the members of Council regarding the previously requested change to the #101 bus route. The delegation thanked Council for its action in the matter and acknowledged that the new routing will become effective on 1986 May 30. The delegation then drew attention to a remaining problem for senior citizen residents of the New Vista complex, noting that their access to Royal Square is still limited in that they are required to take two buses to reach the centre. Council's intervention was requested in order to secure easier access for seniors.
- (b) Mrs. Lydia Best, 8215 Eleventh Avenue, then addressed the members of Council regarding the #101 bus route. The delegation thanked Council for its action in securing the requested change to the #101 bus route to provide direct access to the New Vista seniors' complex. The delegation then noted the difficulty experienced by many senior citizens in gaining access to Royal Square, which presently requires a bus transfer. Council was requested to pursue with B.C. Transit the possibility of a direct bus linking the New Vista complex with the Royal Square shopping area.



Transit for the September 01 Sheet Change are somewhat "ad hoc", they do address the valid concerns of transit patrons, particularly senior citizens. The report notes that municipal staff anticipate further changes and "fine tuning" will occur as a result of the comprehensive post-implementation review of bus/ALRT integration. In the interim, staff recommended that Council approve the changes proposed by B.C. Transit.

The Municipal Manager recommended:

- (1) THAT Council approve the bus route changes proposed by B.C. Transit for implementation in September.
- (2) THAT a copy of the report be sent to B.C. Transit.

The Municipal Manager submitted a report from the Director Finance regarding the proposed maximum daily expense allowance for staff. The report reviews the travel expenses paid to municipal employees and recommends an increase in the expense allowance from \$40 to \$45.

The Municipal Manager recommended:

- (1) THAT the maximum daily expense allowance for staff be increased to \$45; and
- (2) THAT the maximum daily expense allowance be in United States funds when travelling outside of Canada.

22. Planning Challenge Statement for 1987 Operating Budget

The Municipal Manager submitted his Challenge Statement for use in the 1986/87 Performance Planning and Measurement Process. The report notes that the Challenge Statement, as a key element of the planning process, sets out a number of areas to be carefully considered by managers at all levels in the organization as they go through the objective setting process. The report also notes that the Statement has been discussed and approved by the members of the Management Committee.

The Municipal Manager recommended:

(1) THAT the Municipal Manager's Challenge Statement be approved by the Municipal Council for use in the 1986/87 Performance Planning and Measurement Process.

MOVED BY ALDERMAN STUSIAK: SECONDED BY ALDERMAN EMMOTT:

23. Exemptions from Taxation: Progress Report

The Municipal Manager submitted a progress report from the Director Finance regarding exemptions from taxation. The report provides guidelines which reflect the operating principles of the municipality to be used when reviewing applications for permissive exemption from taxation. The subject guidelines will be applied to rented School Board properties which will be returned to the roll by the Assessment Authority and to new applications for the 1987 Assessment Roll. The report advises that the impact of the guidelines will be outlined in the Annual Exemption Report to be presented to Council in 1986 July at which time Council will be requested for formal adoption of the guidelines. The report also advises that a report on the impact of the guidelines on existing church and recreation exempted properties will be prepared for Council's consideration in early 1987.

The Municipal Manager recommended:

(1) THAT the report be received for the information of Council.

24. The Expansion of the Computer System

The Municipal Manager submitted a report from the Director Administrative and Community Services regarding proposed expansion of the municipal computer system. The report advises of an immediate need for additional processor power as a result of acceptance and use of the new computer system having exceeded expectations. The report advises that the expanded use of the computer system has resulted in a revision of the timing of future additions of processing capability. It was therefore necessary to bring forward the recommendation for upgrading the computer earlier than the 1987/88 implementation previously anticipated.

The Municipal Manager recommended:

- (1) THAT the Director Administrative and Community Services be authorized to proceed with the acquistion of the computing equipment, computer software and terminals as specified in the report, and;
- (2) THAT the authority be given to execute the necessary documents to complete those acquisitions.

Alderman Stusiak enquired as to enforcement of parking regulations in the vicinity of Skytrain Stations in the municipality.

The Director Engineering, Mr. E.E. Olson, advised that there is a maximum three hour parking limit between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 6:00 p.m. in all unposted areas of the municipality but enforcement is only applied as a result of citizen complaint. The Director Engineering further advised of complaints received from residents in the vicinity of the Royal Oak Skytrain Station, resulting in a number of tickets having been issued to vehicles parked in violation of the regulation.
