(a) Mrs. Diana West, 7875-18th Avenue, addressed the Members of Council on behalf of residents in the area adjacent to a proposed full service gas station at 7353 - 6th Street. The delegation also submitted a petition containing 78 signatures which is on file in the Office of the Municipal Clerk and the text of which reads as follows;

> "National Energy Equipment Inc., at 7353 - 6th Street, is in the process of applying for permits from the Burnaby Municipality which would allow them to establish a full service, 24 hour gas station serving Natural gas, Propane gas, and regular gases. They have also requested for permission to install a propane tank on the property and to do propane conversions.

We the petitioners request that the above permits not be granted for the following reasons:

- (1) the said property is too close to a blind major corner which could increase the risk of accidents.
- (2) There has been a noticable increase in traffic on residential streets (18th Ave. and 19th Ave. between 6th Street and Canada Way) in the past 4 months. To allow another gas station on the corner of 19th Ave. and 6th St. would further increase the already congested traffic in this residential area.
- (3) There is already a full service, 24 hour gas station serving both propane and regular gases (Super Save Gas Station, 7377 - 6th Street) immediately across the street and on the same side of 6th Street as the above property and also another gas station (Petro Can, corner of 6th St. and 17th Ave.) 1 block south and again on the same side of 6th Street as National Energy Equipment Inc.

(4) National Energy Equipment Inc. has proven to show either a complete lack of knowledge or lack of respect for the law in dispensing natural gas. On several occasions they have released natural gas into the atmosphere to calibrate their pumps or to simply release pressure in their holding tanks. This has been done at different times of the day and night, (sometimes 3 and 4 o'clock in the morning) filling the air and some neighborhood homes with a chemical odor. The Burnaby Fire Dept., Burnaby R.C.M.P., and the G.V.R.D., Pollution Control Dept., have been involved with a number of these incidences. One such incident (June, 1986), the conditions were such that the R.C.M.P. felt it necessary to begin an evacuation of a 6 block radius."

In expressing opposition to the proposed full service station, the delegation suggested that such a facility would be best located in an industrial area, away from residential neighborhoods which would be placed at considerable risk in the event of an explosion.

His Worship, Mayor Lewarne, then adivsed that this matter has been referred to staff and a report will be submitted to the next Regular Meeting of Council to be held on 1986 October 06.

8. Rezoning Reference No. 95/85 Station Square Development Demolition Permits for Existing Residences

> The Municipal Manager submitted a report from the Director Planning and Building Inspection regarding proposed demolition permits for existing residences in connection with Rezoning Reference No. 95/85, the Station Square Development. The report advises that one of the conditions associated with the subject rezoning application, is the standard provision regarding demolition of improvements on the rezoning site after third reading of the associated bylaw. The report advises, however, that there have been numerous instances of vandalism, illegal occupation and the setting of fires within the vacant buildings in spite of efforts by the owners to secure the premises. Therefore, it had been suggested that demolition permits be issued to allow owners to demolish improvements if they so wish as premises are vacated, prior to third reading of the bylaw. The report suggests that issuance of the demolition permit may not be construed as commiting Council to the rezoning request as further consideration is yet to be given at the time of the third reading. If issued, such demolition permits would, therefore, be issued on a "without prejudice" basis.

The Municipal Manager recommended:

(1) THAT staff of the Planning and Building Inspection Department be authorized to issue Demolition Permits upon application by property owners in the area subject to Rezoning Reference #95/85, for the reasons outlined in Director Planning and Building Inspection's report.

9. Parking in The Metrotown Area

Alderman Emmott

His Worship, Mayor Lewarne, reminded Council that the Local Court of Revision for the 1986 List of Electors will be held at 10:00 a.m. on Wednesday, 1986 October 01 in the Council Chamber.

Alderman Rankin

Alderman Rankin was given leave to introduce a motion regarding the erection of political signs in the municipality during the forthcoming provincial election campaign.

MOVED BY ALDERMAN RANKIN: SECONDED BY ALDERMAN STUSIAK:

"THAT Council approve the placement of political signs on municipal property by all participants in the forthcoming provincial election, subject to compliance with Clause (9), Schedule No. 1 of the Burnaby Sign Bylaw."

Alderman Rankin then further discussed the matter of the adverse effects of federal taxes imposed on the motion picture industry in the province and requested that some action be taken in this regard.

ENQUIRIES

Alderman Stusiak

Alderman Stusiak enquired as to the possibility of installing a pedestrian crosswalk for the B.C. Parkway and B.C. Hydro railway tracks following the recent closure of Dow Avenue to through traffic. Alderman Stusiak noted that Dow Avenue residents were presently denied pedestrian access to the Metrotown Centre.

In response, the Municipal Manager, Mr. M. J. Shelley, advised that staff would pursue the matter further with B.C. Parkways.

Alderman Veitch

Alderman Veitch enquired as to the proposed construction date for the pedestrian overpass across Kingsway, connecting to the Metrotown Centre.

In response, His Worship, Mayor Lewarne, advised that the subject overpass and a similar overpass connecting with the Cambridge development will not be constructed until such time as development occurs on the north side of Kingsway.

Alderman Drummond

Alderman Drummond enquired as to the possibility of obtaining information on the average increases in property assessments, broken down into residential, commercial and industrial classes.

The Municipal Manager, Mr. M. J. Shelley, undertook to make an enquiry respecting this matter.

1986 September 29

Alderman Drummond then commented on recent bear sightings in the vicinity of Burnaby Mountain and suggested that the public should be made aware of the potential danger, particularly when using the trail systems in that area.

Alderman Drummond also enquired with respect to the future disposition of the Oakalla lands following recent public announcements by the Premier regarding the intended removal of the Oakalla correctional facility. Alderman Drummond specifically enquired of staff as to official communication being received from the provincial government in this regard.

In response, the Director Planning and Building Inspection, Mr. A. L. Parr, advised that to date, no official communication had been received from the Province; however, there had been recent informal communication on the proposal between provincial and municipal staff.

Alderman McLean

Alderman McLean enquired further with respect to weeds protruding through blacktop at the Patterson Skytrain Station and requested that staff pursue the problem with the contractor responsible.

In response, His Worship, Mayor Lewarne, advised that the subject property is owned by B.C. Parkways and the contractor involved had donated his services to that organization. It was, therefore, not a municipal responsibility.
