REPORT

INTRODUCTION:

On 1985 July 15, Municipal Council approved the funding from internal borrowing for a \$20.9 million Recreation and Cultural Services development program.

Two of the projects scheduled for commencement in 1986 were the construction of the Bonsor Recreation Centre and the expansion of the Cameron Recreation Centre.


BONSOR:

The Municipal Building Co-ordinating Committee and the Parks and Recreation Commission went through an exhaustive process for the selection of an architect for the Bonsor Centre. The process covered several months and many presentations and interviews. The unanimous choice at the conclusion of the process was the appointment of Carlberg Jackson Partners. The Commission approved the appointment on 1985 June 05.

CAMERON:

After reviewing the options for the Cameron Recreation Centre expansion, both the Committee and the Commission agreed to appoint the firm of architects that had been responsible for constructing the Centre some years ago, namely, Howard/Yano Architects. The Commission approved the appointment on 1986 March 05.

The Corporation policy calls for all architect appointments to be ratified by Municipal Council. In both these cases, this step was not taken. In the meantime, work has commenced on both projects and at this time, Council is asked to ratify the appointment of both firms of architects to their respective projects so that full processing authority is in place.
