SUMMARY:

This refers to correspondence directed to "Mayor and Council" under date of 86 April 25, which is stamped as having been received on 86 June 01.

In the petition it is requested by Middlegate Merchants and residents that there be increased surveillance of their properties during the night time hours. In the case of the business premises they request a physical check of exterior doors and windows.

REPORT:

The following is a statistical comparison of crimes occurring during identical time frames in 1985 and 1986. Atoms (geographical areas) 310, 313, and 321 basically make up the portion of the Municipality that is indicated in the 86 April 25 petition to Council. Atoms 325, 326, 327, 330, and 332 were used because the businesses usually are in the Malls and follow particular streets.

These occurrences in crime statistics appear to compare or to be slightly lower than similar areas e.g. Simpsons-Sears Kingsway and Lougheed Mall, North Road.

Burnaby Detachment human resources are deployed equitably in proportion to the likelihood of criminal occurrences throughout the Municipality regardless of time or day. To enhance that practice the local Detachment together with our Ottawa Headquarters in conjunction with Burnaby's Departments of Engineering and Information Services have developed and are in the process of implementing new technical systems (Visually Integrated Crime Analysis Reporting System) to collect data and instantaneously interpret that information in graphic and map form to assist in more finite and faster resource deployment.

Burnaby Detachment maintains an eleven member Burglary Section, one Sergeant, two Corporals and eight Constables selected, trained, and deployed solely for the purpose of burglary investigation.

Burnaby Detachment also conducts foot patrols after business hours in and around shopping malls and business sections of the Municipality, whenever time permits. In addition the Detachment conducts roving patrols on a 24 hour basis.

Burnaby Detachment also has a Community Policing/Crime Prevention Unit composed of one Sergeant, four Constables and one municipal employee to maintain Community Policing/Crime Prevention programmes.

The Burnaby Detachment Community Policing/Crime Prevention Unit is making arrangements with the merchants/residents that were signatory to the 86-04-25 petition to Council to examine the extent of the problem and to jointly plan course(s) of action to harden targets and apprehend criminals.

Burnaby Detachment will continue to distribute human resources proportionate to the likelihood of criminal occurrences equitably throughout the Municipality to protect life and property.
