(a) Mr. Bryan J. Poulin, 1012 Tuxedo Drive, Port Moody, addressed the members of Council regarding a proposal to develop two lots and construct a single-family dwelling at 3778 Nithsdale Street. With the aid of a site plan, the delegation described the proposed development of the subject lots for which R9 rezoning would be required. Council was requested to permit the delegation's application to proceed in view of the need to commence construction before June. It was suggested by the delegation that his application enjoys the support of neighbouring properties who would benefit from a restored storm drain system and stabilization of the land with clean fill material.

- (b) Mr. Frank Helden, 102 6075 Wilson Avenue, then addressed the members of Council regarding various matters of concern in the municipality. The delegation requested that Council pursue left turn filter signalization at the Canada Way/Burris Street and Boundary Road/Imperial Street/E. 49th Avenue intersections. The delegation further suggested the need for paving improvements in the vicinity of the Patterson Skytrain Station and urged installation of sidewalks in the vicinity of the Metrotown Skytrain Station. Finally, the delegation criticized the recently announced cutbacks in transit service, noting that citizens of Burnaby will be inconvenienced.
- (c) Mr. Andrew Blair, then addressed the members of Council on behalf of a group of residents who wish to have their properties rezoned from R5 to R3. The delegation submitted a petition which is on file in the office of the Municipal Clerk and which contains 228 signatures from 186 homes in the area bounded by Canada Way, Sixth Street, 10th Avenue and Edmonds Street. Council was requested to allow rezoning to proceed on the basis that the petitioners represent more than 50 percent of the total number of homes in the subject area.

The delegation advised that residents in the area wished to prevent further development of R9 properties in the subject area.

## 11. Royal Oak Avenue Alignment

The Municipal Manager submitted a report from the Director Engineering regarding proposed realignment and subsequent redesignation of Royal Oak Avenue as a secondary arterial route in Burnaby's Comprehensive Transportation Plan. The report notes hazards and limitations associated with the steep grade on a portion of Royal Oak Avenue which, to date, have precluded its ability to function as a secondary arterial route. The report provides an outline of the evaluation of various alternatives considered to upgrade the road and discusses the most acceptable choice in terms of impacting the surrounding land use while still addressing the major traffic and safety criteria for a secondary arterial route. The report advises that designation of the future realignment of Royal Oak Avenue is required in connection with the Community Plan presently under preparation for the Oakalla Prison lands intended for residential redevelopment.

The Municipal Manager recommended:

(1) THAT Council adopt Option C as further detailed in the report as the design concept for the realignment of Royal Oak Avenue.

> The report further notes that staff transportation planning analysis capability has been extended by use of the EMME2 transportation simulation model. The model studies show that the North Burnaby corridor will continue to have a greater congestion problem because of the limited scope for adding road capacity as well as the rapid growth of the northeast sector and Surrey. Significant transportation improvements to South Burnaby have arisen as a result of improvements to Marine Way and implementation of Skytrain service.

Alderman Stusiak then enquired as to the date of final adoption of the bylaw for the Station Square development and also regarding removal of railway tracks to the site from Central Boulevard.

In response, the Director Planning and Building Inspection, Mr. A.L. Parr, advised that it was anticipated that final reading would be given to the subject bylaw within the next few weeks.

The Deputy Director Engineering, Mr. W.C. Sinclair, then advised that removal of the railway tracks crossing Central Boulevard to the Station Square site can be effected.
