Mr. Zeswick stated that he did not understand the meaning of the results and so does not know whether or not the soil is contaminated.

His Worship, Mayor W.J. Copeland advised Mr. Zeswick that the Environmental Health Department will be requested to provide an analysis of the soil test results.

His Worship, Mayor W.J. Copeland advised that the letter appearing on the Supplementary Agenda as Delegation (f) had been delivered to the Clerk's Department prior to the 1988 September 19 Council Meeting and therefore Council is requested to give consideration to allowing the delegate to appear as the second delegation.

(f) Mr. David Fairey, 7445 Woodbrooke Place, Burnaby, B.C. appeared before Council on behalf of residents in the area of Duthie and Curtis Streets to express their concerns regarding traffic volumes on Duthie and Curtis, and request Council support in requesting the Ministry of Transportation and Highways complete construction of the Hastings/Gaglardi connector.

Mr. Fairey submitted a petition to the Clerk signed by approximately eighty (80) residents requesting Council take immediate action for completion of the Hastings/Gaglardi connector.

The speaker concluded his address by requesting Council make the Hastings/Gaglardi connector a priority and to continue to petition the Provincial Government to undertake construction as soon as possible.

Council requested that copies of the staff report and correspondence submitted to the Minister of Transportation and Highways be forwarded to all residents who signed the petition.

(b) Mr. Kevan Martell, #400 - 935 Marine Drive, North Vancouver, B.C. appeared before Council on behalf of Burnaby businessmen Mr. Carlos Brushani and Mr. Tom Gutreau. Mr. Brushani is the present owner of property located on the corner of Greenall Avenue and Marine Way which is presently zoned M2. Mr. Brushani is in the process of selling the property to Mr. Gutreau.

The speaker advises that the present zoning allows for a car lot as a permitted use, however the Planning Department has advised that in view of the number of commercial businesses along the Marine Way corridor a car lot would not be an appropriate use of subject property. As a result of these comments, the sale of the property has been placed in jeopardy and the purchaser is not willing to proceed until he receives assurance that a car lot will be permitted on the property.

Mr. Martell requested Council's assurance that current zoning and property uses will be honoured by the Municipality.

(c) Mr. Edgar Uhlmann, 3842 Marine Way, Burnaby, B.C. appeared before Council to express support for the current M2 zoning of properties on Marine Way. The speaker advises that he has recently purchased additional property along Marine Way for the purpose of expanding his present business, N.S. Auto Exchange. This property was purchased following receipt of confirmation from the Planning Department that his business conforms with the M2 zone.

Mr. Uhlmann concluded his address by requesting Council give serious consideration to the ramifications of their actions in amending the M2 zone on the small business enterprises along Marine Way.

Mr. Falso provided a list of people contacted to provide carpentry services but advised that he was unsuccessful in hiring anyone and requested additional time to find a carpenter.

The Planning Department is recommending Council take action to declare the structure a nuisance and order its removal.

The Municipal Manager recommended:

- (1) THAT Council declare the building located on the lot at 4231 Pandora Street a nuisance and order that it be removed by its owner within fourteen days after the service of the order.
- (2) THAT Council order that:
 - (a) In the case of default by the owner to comply with the order within the period named in it, the municipality, by its employees or others, may enter and carry out the demolition of the





building, removal of the related debris from the property and backfilling of the excavation at the expense of the owner; and

- (b) In the case of default by the owner to comply with the order, the charges for carrying out the demolition of the building, removal of related debris and backfilling the excavation, including all incidental expenses, if unpaid on 1988 December 31, shall be added to and form part of the taxes payable on the subject land for real property as taxes in arrears.
- (3) THAT the owner, Mr. Franco Falso of Suite 502, 1075 Comox Street, Vancouver, B.C., V6E 1K1, be served with a copy of Council's declaration and order under Recommendations 1 and 2 above.





Research for their analysis. The results of the test show that structurally the ten year old Polybutylene pipe is in very good shape showing no evidence of deterioration. However, additional research is necessary on the pipe sediment to determine its composition. Staff are working with B.C. Research and the results of these tests will be the subject of a future report to Council.
