REPORT OF THE CRIME PREVENTION COMMITTEE

RECOMMENDATION:

1. THAT, during the process of implementing a voluntary Crime Prevention Through Environmental Design strategy, School District staff be invited to participate in any training opportunities that become available to assist in learning about the principles and applications of the concept.

R E P O R T

Council, at the regular Council meeting held on 1988 April 18 received a report from the Director Planning and Building Inspection recommending implementation of a voluntary Crime Prevention Through Environmental Design (C.P.T.E.D.) strategy and adopted the recommendations contained therein. In compliance with recommendation 1.(c) of the report, a copy of the report was forwarded to the Crime Prevention Committee.

The Crime Prevention Committee, at its meeting held on 1988 May 11 received the report of the Director Planning and Building Inspection and discussed the four recommendations contained therein.

With respect to recommendation 1.(b) of the report which reads:

- "1. THAT Council endorse the following actions to be taken by municipal staff in implementing a voluntary Crime Prevention Through Environmental Design (CPTED) strategy:
 - (b) Provision of training opportunities to assist appropriate municipal staff in learning about the principles and applications of CPTED",

your Committee respectfully requests that School District No. 41 staff also be invited to participate in any training opportunities that become available to assist in learning about the principles and applications of the concept as they too have responsibility for architectural design and development approval in Burnaby.
