11. Request from City of Vancouver for Approval to Incinerate Marine Wastes at Burnaby (G.V.R.D.) Refuse Incineration Plant

The Municipal Manager submitted a report from the Director Engineering which explores a number of considerations to be taken into account when examining the request to permit transportation of international marine wastes across Burnaby for disposal at the G.V.R.D. incinerator. These considerations are: the physical makeup of marine waste; the classification of marine waste and attendant jurisdictional considerations; the designation, cleaning, and disinfection of transporting vehicles; the designation of acceptable highway routes; and the impact of incineration of marine wastes on the environment and on the incinerator itself.

The Municipal Manager recommended:

Further, based on Trans Mountain Pipe Line and intervenors evidence at the April 11 to 14 Public Hearings, The Corporation of the District of Burnaby calls upon the National Energy Board to direct Trans Mountain Pipe Line Co. Ltd., to prepare and submit to the appropriate Federal Agency a complete environmental impact statement. We believe an environmental impact statement is essential to address both the many and complex individual concerns raised to date and accumulative social and environmental impacts. Only through an environmental impact statement, which includes a well established public process, can Council and the citizens of Burnaby be assured that all of the impacts of Trans Mountain Pipe Line's proposed expansion are clearly understood and addressed. Until this is done, therefore, Burnaby requests approval by the National Energy Board be withheld."

The results of the informal survey show 100% support from area businesses and 83.3% support from area residents surveyed.
