1. Mr. Michael P. Weiss, 8032 Hudson Street, Vancouver, B.C. addressed the members of Council on behalf of Columbia College and its request for a property tax exemption. Mr. Weiss, the Principal of Columbia College, provided Council with an overview of the activities of the college. The college offers three programs, a University Transfer Program, a High School Graduation Program, and an English as a Second Language Program. The college currently is in the business of serving international students; however, these students do not make up the total student population of the college. The college is a non-profit organization and course fees are structured to ensure that the college is a good employer as well as a quality learning institute. Mr. Weiss distributed a copy of the college calendar to members of Council and extended an invitation to each of them to visit the school at their convenience. In concluding his presentation, Mr. Weiss advised that his purpose for coming before Council was twofold. Firstly, to introduce himself and provide Council with some information about Columbia College and secondly, to request that Council give favorable consideration to the tax exemption, which has been recommended by staff.
