REPORT OF THE CRIME PREVENTION COMMITTEE
Re: Burnaby Youth Services Review

RECOMMENDATION:

1. THAT Council proceed with the hiring of a Youth Services Project Manager, for a period of four months and a maximum cost of \$7,000, to develop a Coordinated Area Multi Service Team (CAMST) pilot to come into effect in January 1990.
2. THAT Canada Assistance Plan funding be sought for this project.

R E P O R T

At the regular Council Meeting held on 1989 May 15 Council received a staff report that was an overview of the findings and recommendations of the Burnaby Youth Services Review. At that time Council adopted the following recommendations:

- "1. THAT Council authorize staff to review the contents of the Youth Services Review with the Youth Outreach Task Force of the Burnaby Inter-Agency Council and, based on the outcome of the discussions, forward a subsequent report to Council with recommendations for advancing the youth services strategy to the first step of implementation.

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The Crime Prevention Committee met on two occasions, 1989 June 14 and 28, with Mr. Gary Hamblin the consultant responsible for preparing the Burnaby Youth Services Review to review and discuss the report. It is the opinion of the Committee that, while they do not endorse any specific recommendations contained within the report, the project is worthy of advancement to the next step of development. The Committee is in favour of hiring a Project Manager to proceed with development of the CAMST model, with the aim of establishing a CAMST pilot project that could be put into effect by January 1990. Proposed terms of reference for the model development process are contained in another report on this agenda from the Director Planning and Building Inspection.

The Committee further resolved that Canada Assistance Plan funding be sought for this project.
