In addition, the Speaker expressed various concerns with regard to relocation of bus stops between the Great Canadian Superstore and Save-on-Foods, the installation of bus shelters along Kingsway, traffic safety matters and taxi services in Burnaby.

2. Mr. Walt Harris, 4350 Beresford Street, Burnaby, B.C. appeared before Council to complain of problems associated with night train traffic through Metrotown. The Speaker provided various suggestions for changes to alleviate the problems, including schedule changes to day trips instead of night operation and changing the train whistle to another form of warning such as a bell.

Mr. Harris also suggested barricading of the Wilson Street crossing combined with the rerouting of transit buses and the upgrading and signalization of the Kingsway crossing to eliminate the whistling requirements.

3. Mr. Herb Davis, 4350 Beresford Street, Burnaby, B.C. appeared before Council to present concerns regarding the night train traffic through Metrotown.

The Speaker suggested amending the hours of operation of the train traffic to day time or early evening schedules to avoid the whistling in the late evening/early morning hours.
