A staff notation attached to Mr. Hopkins' letter advises as follows:

"Attached is a Council Report (Item 9, Report No. 12 dated 1988 February 15) regarding the matter referred to in this letter. The testing of the air emissions from the incinerator as noted in the report has been completed and test results are now being compiled for review by staff, the G.V.R.D. and the Ministry of Environment and Parks. Staff will submit a report on the results of the testing to Council during the month of March, 1989."

A letter dated 1989 January 17 was received from B.C. Transit addressed to D.M.M. Baynton of Burnaby, in response to comments and suggestions outlined in a letter to B.C. Transit from Mr. Baynton dated 1988 December 28.

(c) Surrey Beekeepers Association, Treasurer, 1989 January 20, Re: Honeybee Colonies

A letter dated 1989 January 20 was received from the Surrey Beekeepers Association expressing concern with regard to Municipal bylaws regarding the control of honey bees within the Municipality.

A staff notation attached to this item of correspondence advises that a multi material curbside collection program with overall coordination on a Regional scale is expected to take place sometime in mid 1990. An interim recycling depot will open at the Stride Avenue disposal site on Saturday, 1989 February 04. Staff will contact Mr. Lee Stanley of the Cooperative Housing Association to discuss with him in greater detail the actions that have been taken by the Municipality in regard to the recycling of waste.

(e) Strataco/Bradson, Property Manager, 1989 January 23,

Re: Cascade Village - Northwest corner of Strata Plan 2153 -Water drainage problem

- (a) Tabled Matter Gilley Alternate Review
 - (a) Transportation Committee
 Re: Gilley Alternate Review

The Transportation Committee submitted a report to Council prepared in response to Council's request for a fundamental review of the Gilley Alternate. As a result of the review the Committee concludes that the Gilley Alternate should not be built at this time. The Committee suggests that the proposed Marine Way/10th Avenue Connector coupled with an improved Griffiths/19th/20th route are much more useful in meeting arterial traffic needs.

The Transportation Committee recommended:

- (1) THAT the 5 Year Capital Budget accord high priority to Marine Way/10th Avenue Connector construction coupled with the Griffiths/19th/20th Street improvement in order to allow for the early declassification of Gilley Avenue as a truck route.
- (2) THAT the construction of the northern portion of the Gilley Alternate that crosses the Byrne Creek Ravine and the B.C. Hydro Right-of-Way and links to Edmonds Street be deleted from the Municipality's 5 Year Capital Budget.
- (3) THAT authority be given to pursue upgrading of Stride Avenue southwest of the 19th Street route in recognition of its function as the major link between Edmonds Town Centre South and the wider Community Plan area and a primary gateway to Edmonds Town Centre South.
