Mr. Perticarini is confined to a wheelchair and wishes to construct a house larger than that permitted under present zoning in order to allow access to all areas of the house by wheelchair. The proposed residence will be approximately 6,000 square feet and consist of two and a half stories at the front and one and a half at the rear. The incline of the lot does not permit symmetrical construction.

The speaker concluded by reiterating his request for reconsideration of Council's decision with regard to Rezoning Reference No. 42/89.

Alderman Nikolai retired from the Council Chamber at 7:22 p.m.

In accordance with Section 240 of the Municipal Act of B.C., His Worship, Mayor W.J. Copeland brought back for reconsideration the resolution of Council being "THAT the recommendation of the Municipal Manager be adopted" as **NEGATIVED AND LOST** at the regular Council Meeting on 1989 October 23.

Mr. Hamilton provided background information on the role and purpose of the Foundation and advised that they do not receive financial assistance from the Provincial Government. As a result they are not in a position to be able to afford to construct the underground parking and are therefore requesting permission to provide surface parking on the B.C. Hydro right-of-way.

13. Issue of Underground Parking related to proposed Multi-Tenant Research Facility Discovery Parks S.F.U. Site - RZ #52/89

> The Municipal Manager submitted a report from the Director Planning and Building Inspection outlining alternative options to the provision of underground parking for the proposed multi-tenant research facility at Discovery Parks, S.F.U. site.

The options presented were as follows:

- a) 95 spaces, say 3 surface parking pods, within the B.C. Hydro right-of-way. Restricting further surface parking to the B.C. Hydro right-of-way within which major forestation is precluded may be appropriate. (The B.C. Hydro right-of-way is described and illustrated in the rezoning report).
- b) 70 surface parking spaces within the B.C. Hydro right-of-way and 25 surface parking spaces within Area "A" precinct, as outlined on the applicant's submitted plans. (Area "A" precinct is the building site, described and illustrated in the rezoning report).

The Municipal Manager recommended:

Both methods separate metals, glass, and plastics, recycle these materials and further process the remaining solid waste. The Biagro method takes the organic portion of the solid waste, composts them with a patented process, producing a pelletized fertilizer. The Reuter Resource Recovery method utilizes these organics to produce a refuse-derived fuel.
