


The speaker addressed the issues of taxicab response times and the provision of means to encourage growth of the taxi business in Burnaby through the issuance of new taxicab licences.





A staff notation appended to this item of correspondence advises that the attached resolution urges a moratorium on actions directed toward phasing out illegal suites, and specifically refers to the District of North Vancouver and the City of Vancouver where phasing out programs have been contemplated in the past or are presently under consideration. The resolution is not directly pertinent to the Municipality of Burnaby where no phasing-out program is in place. (As Council is aware, enforcement of the zoning bylaw with respect to illegal suites in Burnaby is undertaken on the basis of written complaints received by the Building Inspection Division.) Unless otherwise directed by Council this information will be conveyed to the correspondent.




