

RECOMMENDATION:

1. THAT Council be requested to bid on the 1994 B.C. Winter Games.

REPORT

The Government of British Columbia is currently inviting the communities of B.C. to bid on the 1993 and 1994 British Columbia Winter and Summer Games. The attached correspondence was received by Council at its meeting of 1990 May 22 (Attachment #1).

The Commission is asked to consider hosting one of these events and make a recommendation to Council.

BACKGROUND:

The Corporation of Burnaby has hosted a range of regional, Provincial and National events over the years, including the 1983 B.C. Summer Games. It is staff's feeling that all these events have been a very positive experience for those directly involved and a credit to Burnaby as the host.

The larger events, such as the Canada Games and B.C. Summer Games, require advance planning which is now being initiated by the Provincial Government, and a major volunteer commitment from the community. In the past Burnaby citizens have enthusiastically volunteered for these occasions and staff would predict good support for supporting one of these games.

PROPOSAL:

It is recommended that the Corporation bid for the 1994 Winter Games. Upon reviewing the range of possible sport events (Attachment #2), it is clear Burnaby is in a good position to provide quality facilities for most all events. The skiing events would require the support of one or more of the ski areas on the North Shore. The details of acquiring the support of one or more of the ski areas would be confirmed before bidding.

The Winter Games are being held for the first time on the Coast in 1991 at Duncan/North Cowichan. The opportunity to possibly host the first Winter Games in the Lower Mainland is an exciting prospect. This event is a major festival that will bring the community together again following the 1992 Centennial events.

**GAMES STRUCTURE AND FUNDING:**

The community is responsible for establishing a Host Community Society with a Games Board of Directors. The Directors include representatives from the community and the B.C. Summer and Winter Games Society; and work in close cooperation with the Provincial Sport Organizations to carry out all aspects of the event.

The Winter Games are structured to involve approximately 3,000 participants over a four day period, usually in late February. It has been the past experience that a festival of this size requires 3,000 plus volunteers.

The funding for the Games is the responsibility of the Province and Municipality. Local sponsorship is also a source of revenue. The Province allocates the major funds of approximately \$600,000. The Municipality must in its bid provide a Resolution of the Council for a financial contribution of at least \$25,000 in cash, and a minimum of \$35,000 in additional in-kind services and facilities. Detail budgets will be established following the awarding of the Games.

**LEGACY:**

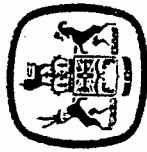
The Provincial Government in addition to the operating funds will give the Host Community a Legacy of \$70,000 to be used for amateur sport and recreation groups in the community. This amount will be augmented by profits from the souvenir sales in the community. For example Penticton hosted the Winter Games this year and realized a legacy of approximately \$200,000.

**APPLICATION:**

Should the Corporation chose to make application for the Games a formal Bid must be submitted to the B.C. Summer and Winter Games Society prior to 1990 October 15.

If Commission and Council are in agreement, staff will prepare a formal application and submit it to Council for Resolution. The application will require verification from the School Board indicating their support for the Games and willingness to donate the necessary school facilities required; plus documented interest and support of local service clubs and any other supporting agents.

Playoffs are currently underway for the upcoming Summer Games in Prince George (July 12-15, 1990) and plans are being made for the next Winter Games in Duncan/North Cowichan (February 21-24, 1991). Participation has always been a key element in the British Columbia Summer and Winter Games. In keeping with this tradition, plans are underway in Prince George for recruiting the necessary 4,000 volunteers to host the 4,000 participants in 45 sporting events, ranging in age from 13 to 80 years.


The Government of British Columbia will provide approximately \$800,000 to each of the successful communities to host the 1993 and 1994 Summer Games, and approximately \$600,000 to each of the successful communities to host the 1993 and 1994 Winter Games. In return for staging these successful Games, the Government of British Columbia will also provide a \$70,000 legacy grant to each host community, as well as profits from souvenir sales, to thank the many volunteers for their efforts. These funds must be allocated to amateur sport and recreation groups.
