60-14-138 - INSTALLATION OF TRAFFIC SIGNALS AND INTER-SECTION CONTROLS AT VARIOUS LOCATIONS

60-30-070 - SITE PREPARATION FOR PROPOSED UPGRADE TO SANITARY PUMP STATION AT GILMORE AVENUE/DAWSON STREET

PURPOSE: To obtain approval of work orders #60-14-138 and #60-30-070.

RECOMMENDATION:

1. THAT work orders #60-14-138 and #60-30-070, as more specifically referred to in this report, be approved.

REPORT

60-14-138 Installation of traffic control devices at various locations.

Charge: 1990 Capital Budget \$56,500  
Code 14 - Traffic Management

Additional Information: Appearing elsewhere on the Council agenda is an item recommending award of Contract #9013 for the installation of traffic control devices. Three of the installations included in the contract are:

- special crosswalk - Royal Oak Avenue and Beresford Street;
- traffic signal - Royal Oak Avenue and Rumble Street;
- intersection flasher - Sussex Avenue and Rumble Street.

This work order provides partial funding for these installations. The required balance is funded from existing work orders in the 1990 Capital Budget under Code 14 - Traffic Management, which have been previously approved by Council.

60-30-070 Site Preparation for Proposed Upgrade to Sanitary Pump Station at Gilmore Avenue/Dawson Street

Charge: 1990 Capital Budget \$80,000  
Code 30 - Sanitary Extensions

Additional Information: The 1990 Capital Budget includes provision for replacement of the sanitary pump station that is located at Dawson Street/Gilmore Avenue (Gilmore #1). The proposed site contains highly compressible soils which require "pre-loading" prior to major construction. Total estimated cost of fill placement and monitoring of subsequent settlement is \$80,000, funds for which are included in the 1990 Capital Budget under Code 30 - Sanitary Extensions.
