The speaker concluded by reading various excerpts from the Burnaby Economic Development Strategy in support of the Beer and Wine Store application.

Arising from the discussion Council Members requested that staff provide a plot plan of liquor outlets in Burnaby, their location, social and neighbourhood situations and a copy of previously adopted liquor licence policies.

2. Mr. Ronald Elliott, representing Wesbild Enterprises Ltd., 1380 Burrard Street, Vancouver appeared before Council to request approval of the establishment of a 2,650 sq. ft. facility to house a Beer and Wine Store at Station Square in Metrotown.

The speaker addressed previous concerns expressed by Council regarding the proximity of the location to other liquor outlets and the prevalence of a large youth population in the area. Mr. Elliott stated that according to a recent study, only 7 per cent of the population in the area is youth with the balance being 25 to 40 year olds without children.

The operators plan to maintain a 24 hour security service in conjunction with this establishment.

The speaker concluded by requesting Council's favourable consideration of the application.

He was informed that if he wished to act on this suggestion, the Municipality would offer the services of a staff person who is fluent in Hungarian to facilitate communication and thereby overcome any language problems that may exist. Mr. Phillips declined the offer, and although acknowledging that the Municipality considers this to be a civil matter, expressed a desire for Council to be made aware of his concerns.

In the event that existing improvements on the site are vacant and considered to be unsafe, unstable, and a hazard to life, the Fire Prevention Office may recommend immediate demolition of such improvements and removal of the resultant debris prior to Third Reading.
- e) The granting of any necessary easements.
- f) The dedication of any rights-of-way deemed requisite.
- g) The undergrounding of existing overhead wiring abutting the site.
- h) The approval of the Ministry of Transportation and Highways to the rezoning application.


# 15. Automobile Repair Services and Motor Vehicle Inspection

The Municipal Manager submitted a report from the Director Planning and Building Inspection outlining proposed text amendments to the Burnaby Zoning Bylaw to permit automobile repair services and motor vehicle inspections in certain commercial and industrial zoning districts. This amendment would enable some automotive businesses to receive a licence from the Motor Vehicle Department to conduct compulsary testing of commercial vehicles and testing of private vehicles according to regulations of the Motor Vehicle Act. This amendment would also apply to businesses which conduct vehicle inspections outside of the government programs, usually as a component of a gas station, an auto retail store or car dealership.

Alderman Lawson returned to the Council Chamber at 9:46 p.m. and took her place at the Council table.

The Municipal Manager recommended:

- 1) THAT Council authorize the Municipal Solicitor to prepare a bylaw amending the Burnaby Zoning Bylaw to:
  - a) add a definition for "automobile repair services" to indicate the types of services and the weight of vehicles, as outlined in the report of 1990 February 12;
  - add a definition for "motor vehicle inspections" that specifically excludes motor vehicle emission testing as a principle use;



- d) permit automobile repair services and motor vehicle inspections as uses to be provided in conjunction with automobile showrooms in the General Commercial (C3) and Service Commercial (C4) Districts;
- e) permit automobile repair services and motor vehicle inspections as uses to be provided in conjunction with the retail sale of new and remanufactured automobile parts and accessories in a Comprehensive Development District using General Commercial guidelines (CD (C3));
- f) permit automobile repair services and motor vehicle inspections as uses to be provided in conjunction with the retail sale of new or used automobile parts and accessories in the Service Commercial (C4) District;
- g) permit motor vehicle inspections as a principle use in the Service Commercial (C4) District;
- h) amend the definition of "automobile repair shop" (which pertains to the M1, M2, M3, M4 and M6 industiral districts) to include motor vehicle inspections.
- 2) THAT Council authorize the bylaw be forwarded to First Reading on 1991 January 07 and to a Public Hearing on 1991 January 29.

# MOVED BY ALDERMAN NIKOLAI: SECONDED BY ALDERMAN LAWSON:

"THAT the recommendations of the Municipal Manager be adopted."

#### 16. Animal Control: 1990 and 1991 SPCA Contracts

The Municipal Manager recommended:

- 1) THAT the contract with the S.P.C.A. be renewed retroactively for the period 1990 January 01 to 1990 December 31 at a total cost of \$294,542, plus 35% commission on dog licences sold through the S.P.C.A., and further;
- 2) THAT the contract with the S.P.C.A. be renewed for the period 1991 January 01 to 1991 December 31 at a total cost of \$312, 229, plus 35% commission on dog licences sold through the S.P.C.A.

## 17. New Vista Society

The Municipal Manager submitted a report from the Director Finance prepared in response to a request from the New Vista Society for a "one time grant" of \$35,000 to pay for tax increases which have resulted from supplementary roll adjustments to the 1989 and 1990 assessment rolls. Finance Department staff advised that the awarding of such a grant would be inconsistent with Council's policy that full taxation within the power of Council should apply to seniors' housing. This policy was established in 1974 and confirmed in 1988 when Council extended it to include community care facilities, licenced group homes, private hospitals and assisted family housing.

The Municipal Manager recommended:

1) THAT a copy of this report be sent to Nan Blackmore, President, and Denny Beaudin, Administrator of the New Vista Society.

- 1) THAT Council approve each of the following eighteen resolutions:
  - 1) Acquisition of Easements and Rights-of-Way

"The Municipal Council does hereby authorize the staff in 1991 to acquire, without referral to Council, all easements and rights-of-way that are required for municipal purposes when the compensation does not exceed \$3,500 in each case";

2) Release, Discharge and Cancellation of Easements and Ancillary Rights

"The Municipal Council does hereby authorize the execution of all documents in 1991 that pertain to the release or discharge of easements and cancellation of ancillary rights where, in the opinion of the Director Engineering, such rights are no longer required";

3) Right-of-Way Encroachments and Pole Anchor Agreements

"The Municipal Council does hereby authorize the Municipal Clerk in 1991 to executive documents on behalf of the Corporation, and the Director Engineering to sign letters, without referral to Council, on:

- a) Encroachment on easements and road allowances
- b) Reduction of easement width
- c) Granting of pole anchor easements to public utility companies";



### 4) Covenants

"The Municipal Council does hereby authorize the Municipal Clerk in 1991 to execute, on behalf of the Corporation, without referral to Council, the following covenants pursuant to Section 215 of the Land Title Act:

- a) Limitation of building elevations due to:
  - Sewer depth
  - Topography
  - Access
  - Land subject to flooding
- b) Vehicular access restriction
- c) Landscape buffers
- d) Yard setbacks";
- 5) Covenants/Limitations on the Occupancy of Single and Two-Family Dwellings

"The Municipal Council does hereby authorize the Municipal Clerk in 1991 to execute on behalf of the Corporation, without referral to Council, those covenants that involve limitations on the occupancy of single-family and two-family dwellings pursuant to Section 215 of the Land Title Act";

### 6) Servicing Agreements

"The Municipal Council does hereby authorize the Municipal Clerk in 1991 to execute Servicing Agreements on behalf of the Corporation pursuant to Section 991 of the Municipal Act, without referral to Council";

### 7) Truncations

"The Municipal Council does hereby authorize the staff in 1991 to acquire, without referral to Council, all truncations required for municipal purposes when the compensation does not exceed \$3,500 in each case, with the understanding that compensation in each case may include the restoration and/or relocation of plant material";

### 8) Discharge of Redundant Rights-of-Way

"The Municipal Council does hereby authorize the Municipal Clerk in 1991 to execute on behalf of the Corporation, without referral to Council, discharges involving rights-of-way that become redundant as a result of the subdivision process where, in the opinion of the Director Engineering, such rights-of-way are redundant";

#### 9) Claims

"The Municipal Council does hereby authorize the Municipal Solicitor in 1991 to approve for payment, without referral to Council, the payment of claims that do not exceed \$5,000 subject to the receipt of appropriate releases";

#### 10) <u>Conferences</u>

"The Municipal Council does hereby authorize the Municipal Manager in 1991 to approve, without referral to Council, all requests for attendance at conferences when the estimated cost related to a single conference does not exceed \$1,500";

### 11) Walk-a-Thons, Fun Runs and Bike-a-Thons

"The Municipal Council does hereby authorize the Director Engineering in 1991 to approve all requests for walk-a-thons, fun runs and bike-a-thons subject to the understanding that the Engineering Department will coordinate and obtain approval from the Officer-in-Charge, Burnaby Detachment, R.C.M.P., and in cases where it may be necessary, the Parks and Recreation Department and the Provincial Ministry of Transportation and Highways; and

That all letters to Council from persons who request permission to hold walk-a-thons, fun runs and bike-a-thons be acknowledged directly by the Director Engineering, without referral to Council, except that if there are unusual circumstances, both the letter and a report will be submitted to Council for consideration";

### 12) Fee for the Recovery of Unlicenced Bicycles

"The Municipal Council does hereby authorize the Municipal Manager in 1991, without referral to Council, to set the recovery fee for the return of unlicenced bicycles";

13) Sale of Printed Material, Microfilmed Information and Information from Computerized Data Bases to the Public

"The Municipal Council does hereby authorize the Municipal Manager in 1991, without referral to Council, to set and adjust prices for printed material, microfilmed information from computerized data bases that are produced by the Municipality and sold to the public";

14) Expenses - Council Members' Attendance on Executive Committees: LMMA, UBCM & FCM

"The Municipal Council does hereby authorize the Director Finance in 1991 to reimburse any members of Council for expenses incurred while representing the Municipality beyond its borders as a member of an Executive Committee of the (a) Lower Mainland Municipal Association (LMMA), (b) Union of British Columbia Municipalities (UBCM) and (c) the Federation of Canadian Municipalities (FCM)";

15) Expenses - Council Members' Attendance at Lower Mainland Municipal Association (LMMA) Meetings

"The Municipal Council does hereby authorize the Director Finance in 1991 to reimburse any members of Council for expenses incurred while representing the Municipality at Lower Mainland Municipal Association meetings that are held beyond its borders";

16) Business Trip Expenses for the Mayor and Acting Mayor

"The Municipal Council does hereby authorize the Director Finance in 1991 to reimburse the Mayor or Acting Mayor for out-of-pocket expenses that are incurred when they represent the Municipality on municipal business beyond the boundaries of the Municipality";

#### 17) Flowers and Gifts

"The Municipal Council does hereby authorize the Mayor, Acting Mayor and Municipal Clerk in 1991 to approve for payment, without referral to Council, expenditures for flowers and gifts for citizens' birthdays and anniversaries";

#### 18) Donations to Charitable Organizations

"The Municipal Council does hereby authorize the Mayor, Acting Mayor and Personnel Director in 1991 to approve, without referral to Council, donations to charitable organizations in memory of staff members who have passed away."

The Municipal Manager submitted a report from the Acting Chief Public Health Inspector prepared and response to questions and concerns raised by Council with regard to correspondence from the Honourable N. Jacobsen concerning the establishment of group homes in Burnaby. Municipal staff advised that there are eight group homes which have been established in Burnaby as a result of the deinstitutionalization program affecting Woodlands. It is the conclusion of staff that services to support these group homes have not been developed at a rate fast enough to meet the demand.

The Municipal Manager recommended:

1) THAT this report be received for information purposes.

The Municipal Manager submitted a report from the Director Planning and Building Inspection advising Council of the proposed issuance of demolition permits for vacant dwellings in the 3700 blocks of Dominion Street and Norfolk Street east of Boundary Road. The vacant dwellings have been the subject of complaints from the surrounding neighbourhood and have been the object of vandalism which has required them to be resecured several times. The grounds surrounding the dwellings are being used to dump refuse and the Environmental Health Department and Fire Department have inspected the site and advised the area is unsightly. As a result of the condition of these premises the developer is requesting permission to demolish the eight dwellings prior to Third Reading of the rezoning amendment bylaw.



The Municipal Manager recommended:

THAT prerequisite "d" (Item 7, Manager's Report No. 23, 1990 March 26) of Rezoning Reference #75/89 pertaining to the removal of the improvements to the site within six months of the rezoning being completed but not prior to Third Reading, be modified to permit the immediate demolition of eight dwellings on the site as requested by the developer.


