

RE: PROFESSIONAL GOLF CONTRACT FOR BURNABY MOUNTAIN GOLF COURSE

RE : **PROFESSIONAL GOLF CONTRACT FOR BURNABY MOUNTAIN GOLF COURSE**
PURPOSE: To request an extension to the current contract for Professional Golf Services at Burnaby Mountain Golf Course.

RECOMMENDATION:

1. THAT authorization be given to negotiate an extension to the contract with Richard Leisen Golf Professional Limited and Richard Leisen, Golf Professional, as outlined in this report.

REPORT

The contract with Richard Leisen for Professional Golf Services at Burnaby Mountain Golf Course expires on 1990 December 31.

The agreement requires the Corporation to provide 120 days notice to terminate the agreement. This means by 1990 September 01, the Corporation must advise the Professional whether or not we will be renewing the contract.

The contract was for a period of three years. In accordance with a Council directive, every three years the Corporation goes out to the market with a public bid for services for the following three years. This has been our practice since 1976.

Nine holes of the Riverway Golf Course will be open for play in 1992 and there will be a number of options open to us at that time for the management of the total golf program including Burnaby Mountain, Riverway and the two pitch and putts.

It is considered premature to hire a professional for Riverway this far in advance. Therefore, in order to keep our options open for a comprehensive public bid call for the total golf program for 1992, it is recommended that we negotiate an extension to the current contract with Richard Leisen to span the intervening months.


