The Municipal Manager submitted a report from the Director Planning and Building Inspection providing Council with detailed information regarding a rezoning application submitted by VanCity Enterprises Ltd. for the northern portion of Metrotown Area 14. The purpose of the rezoning is to construct an office tower development on an area which would incorporate privately owned and Municipally owned properties. The subject site encompasses the block bounded by Kingsway, McKay Avenue, Kingsborough Street and Willingdon Avenue.

The Municipal Manager recommended:

- (1) THAT the amendment to the Metrotown Development Plan, Sub-area 14 as entailed by the development concept outlined in Section 4.0 of this report be approved.
- (2) THAT staff be authorized to work with applicant towards the preparation of a suitable plan of development for presentation to a Public Hearing.
- (3) THAT Council indicate its willingness to include the Municipally-owned property within the subject development and that the Municipal Solicitor be authorized to pursue preliminary discussions with the developer relative to the offering of the Municipal properties for sale for inclusion in the project in line with the development options outlined in this report.

1. Computer Capital Equipment

The Municipal Manager submitted a report from the Information Services Director requesting authority to purchase equipment to meet the computing needs of the new Metrotown Library and to undertake the postponed expansion of the Municipal Hall computer site.

The Municipal Manager recommended:

- (1) THAT Council authorize expenditures of \$1,676,656 for purchase of the equipment specified in Appendix A to meet the expanded computing needs of the new Metrotown Library and the Municipal Hall Computer Cluster.
- (2) THAT a purchase order be issued to BTE for the equipment shown on Appendix-B at an estimated cost of \$1,291,630 with terms and conditions to be finalized by the Purchasing Agent.

Desirability and Feasibility of Collecting Development Cost Charges for Establishment of Child Care Facilities and Other Social Amenities

The Municipal Manager submitted a report from the Director Planning and Building Inspection prepared in response to Council's request for an investigation of the desirability and feasibility of seeking Provincial authority to collect development cost charges to be used for establishment of child care facilities and other social amenities and to provide information on how to ensure child care facilities are equipped and operated once they have been secured through the rezoning process.

Municipal staff recommend that Burnaby Council endorse a resolution to the 1990 U.B.C.M convention requesting the Minister of Municipal Affairs amend Section 985 of the Municipal Act to give municipalities authority to collect development cost charges for child care facilities and other social amenities as deemed necessary by the Municipality. In addition, staff recommend that the Municipality rely on restrictive covenants, registered under Section 215 of the Land Title Act to ensure that child care facilities are operating once they have been secured through the rezoning process.

The Municipal Manager recommended:

- (1) THAT Council endorse the proposed resolution for the 1990 UBCM Convention, appearing elsewhere on this agenda, which requests the Minister of Municipal Affairs to amend Section 985 of the Municipal Act to give municipalities authority to collect development cost charges for child care facilities and other social amenities as deemed necessary by the Municipality.
- (2) THAT staff be authorized to develop a policy to govern the establishment and ongoing operation of child care facilities once such facilities have been secured through the rezoning process.

- .Development cost charges for "social" services and amenities
- .Rental tenure land use control
- .Recycled content and procurement of manufactured goods
- .Regulating the expansion of existing hazardous industries
- .Municipal authority to enact standards of maintenance bylaws

The Municipal Manager recommended:

- (1) THAT Council approve the submission of the resolutions contained in Section 2.0 of this report to the Lower Mainland Municipal Association and the 1990 UBCM Convention.
- (2) THAT Council approve the resubmission of the resolution contained in Section 3.0 of this report concerning municipal authority to enact standards of maintenance by-laws to the Lower Mainland Municipal Association and the 1990 UBCM Convention.
- (3) THAT a copy of this report be forwarded to the UBCM, Suite 15, 1055 Shellbridge Way, Richmond, B.C., V6X 2W9.

6. Construction of Washrooms -Barnet Marine Park

The Municipal Manager submitted a report from the Director Recreation and Cultural Services requesting prior approval for the expenditure of capital funds and for the awarding of a contract for construction of washrooms at Barnet Marine Park. The funds are to cover design fees, building costs, site preparation, servicing, landscaping and walkways.

The Municipal Manager recommended:

- (1) THAT prior approval be given to the re-allocation and expenditure of \$50,000 from the Parks and Recreation Department 1990 1994 Capital budget to provide additional required funds for the construction of washrooms at Barnet Marine Park.
- (2) THAT a contract in the amount of \$192,480 be awarded to Schultz Ritter for the construction of washrooms at Barnet Marine Park.

The Municipal Manager requested that Recommendation No. 2 be deleted as it will be the subject of a more detailed report to be submitted to Council at the regular meeting on 1990 April 30.

7. Process for November 1990 Dedication of Parklands

The Municipal Manager submitted a report from the Director Recreation and Cultural Services advising Council of the process for dedication of park areas in the November civic election. Parks and public use areas currently under consideration for dedication in November 1990 include: the ravines of the South Slope, the Fraser River Foreshore Park, Deer Lake, Robert Burnaby Park, Burnaby Mountain Park and Burnaby Mountain Conservation Area, Barnet Marine Park and other Municipal properties strategically located along Burrard Inlet and Central Park. Those properties currently under the jurisdiction of the Provincial Government which include Central Park and a 25 acre Provincially owned parcel within the Burnaby Mountain Conservation Area will be included on the November ballot if negotiations have been concluded for free crown grants to transfer subject properties from the Provincial Government to the Municipality.

The Municipal Manager recommended:

(1) THAT this report be received for information purposes.

The report includes a draft letter addressed to the Minister of Transportation and Highways outlining Council's interests and concerns with regard to the proposed improvements.

The Municipal Manager recommended:
