RECOMMENDATIONS:

1. THAT Council endorse Stoney Creek Community School's "Great Salmon Send-Off" celebration on 1990 June 03, and that the Parks and Recreation Department and Environmental Health Department assist where required.
2. THAT the "Great Salmon Send-Off" be included in Burnaby's program of events for National Environment Week.

R E P O R T

Council at the regular Council Meeting held on 1990 January 29 received a letter from Stoney Creek Community School requesting endorsement of the "Great Salmon Send-Off" festivities planned for 1990 June 03.

This event offers the general public an opportunity to gather on the banks of the Brunette River and participate in a number of recreational and educational activities, one of which is a simultaneous release of Coho fry by Burnaby school children who are active in the Salmonid Enhancement Program.

The initiative for this event has come from the members of Stoney Creek Community Council. Other key players include the Sapperton Fish and Game Club, Federal Department of Fisheries, the Chamber of Commerce and Burnaby schools involved with the salmonid enhancement program. This initiative has been endorsed by the Burnaby School District.

The Environment and Waste Management Committee, at its meeting held on 1990 February 13, unanimously endorsed both the "Great Salmon Send-Off" celebration and its inclusion in the events planned in Burnaby in recognition of National Environment Week.
