MUNICIPAL MANAGER'S RECOMMENDATION:

SUBJECT: FIRE DEPARTMENT 4TH QUARTERLY REPORT 1989
PURPOSE: To provide Council with information relating to the Fire Department's activities for the 4th Quarter, 1989.

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RECOMMENDATION:

1. THAT this Report be received for information purposes.

R E P O R T

- * This Department responded to 2,128 alarms during the 4th quarter of 1989. Of these, 49 (24 building, 23 vehicle and two miscellaneous) were fires which resulted in a dollar loss of \$277,465.
 - * Eighteen (8 building and 10 vehicle) of the fires with dollar loss were arson/set, suspicious or cause unknown.
 - * A juvenile suspect has been charged in connection with a set fire at The Maples on December 10. There was no dollar loss.
 - * Twenty-eight firefighters suffered smoke or hazardous materials exposure/inhalation, and 16 sustained minor injuries (lacerations, contusions, sprains, burns, etc.), with no time loss.
 - * Four firefighters were off work for a total of 16 Shifts as a result of sustained injuries (sprains and lacerations).
 - * Four citizens suffered smoke inhalation, and one sustained light burns to hand in addition to suffering smoke inhalation.
 - * The 4th quarter is usually the busiest in a public education context because it includes Fire Prevention Week, Halloween, the beginning of fireplace and chimney use, and the Christmas holidays.
- The Public Education Officer was involved in several public displays, media exposure, demonstrations and other related events, and general fire safety lectures with videos given to over 500 children and adults.
- * Additional statistical information relating to this Department's activities for the 4th quarter is attached to this Report.
