RE: FUNDING FOR IMPLEMENTATION OF YOUTH
SERVICES DELIVERY MODEL

RECOMMENDATIONS:

1. THAT Council authorize staff to include \$50,000 in the 1990 Annual Operating Budget as the Municipal contribution to funding for implementation, on a pilot basis, of a Coordinated Area Multi-Service Team (C.A.M.S.T.) model of youth service delivery in south east Burnaby, as described in this report.

R E P O R T

Council at the regular Council Meeting held on 1990 March 26 received a report from the Director Planning and Building Inspection dated 1990 March 12 requesting that Council provide funding assistance for implementation of the pilot phase of the proposed Coordinated Area Multi-Service Team (C.A.M.S.T.) model of youth services delivery. Council subsequently referred the report to the Community Issues and Social Planning Committee for review.

Considerable progress has been made in developing a youth services model for Burnaby. A Senior Advisory Committee for the model has been established, funding submissions have been forwarded to five potential funding sources, and an area of the Municipality has been identified for implementing a pilot C.A.M.S.T.

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It is recommended that Council continue its leadership role with respect to the youth services model by authorizing staff to include \$50,000 in the 1990 Annual Operating Budget for implementation of the pilot C.A.M.S.T. The expectation is that funding will also be provided from the other funding bodies from which funding was requested. After the necessary funding has been committed, work can begin immediately to establish the pilot C.A.M.S.T. in south east Burnaby. The pilot should be fully operational before the summer, providing a framework for youth-serving agencies and community members to address the needs of "at risk" youth in the area.

On an ongoing basis, staff will keep the Community Issues and Social Planning Committee informed of progress made in implementing the pilot. The pilot will be formally evaluated by an outside evaluator after one year of operation. Staff will inform Council and the Community Issues and Social Planning Committee of the results of this evaluation.

Arising out of the Committee's consideration of this report on 1990 March 28, a motion was unanimously adopted to support the recommendations of the Director Planning and Building Inspection, being recommendations 1 and 2.
