In addition, the proposed relocation would reduce available on street parking by approximately 45 feet.

Ms. Robin advised that the apartment residents also opposed relocation of the bus stop and as an alternative requested that the stop be eliminated completely.

The Municipal Manager submitted a report from the Director Engineering providing Council with background information on the relocation of a bus stop to 5010/5030 Hastings Street. The relocation of the bus stop has occurred at the request of B.C. Transit. B.C. Transit cites operational difficulties and safety concerns as the reason for the relocation.

The speaker advised that the site provides sufficient parking for the facility and that right turn only signs would be installed at the egress to Canada Way. Signs will also be posted requesting patrons to leave quietly, the hours of operation would be amended to close at 12:30 a.m. Monday through Saturday and 10:00 p.m. on Sunday, the seating capacity would be reduced from 225 to 175 and a canvass of the immediate neighbourhood has been conducted which shows strong support for the club. In conclusion, the speaker requested that Council grant positive consideration to the application.

Tabled Item No. 4, 1991 January 14 was brought forward for consideration at this time.

3. Liquor Licence Application No. 7/90 Blue Button Club 3787 Canada Way

The Municipal Manager submitted a report from the Director Planning and Building Inspection advising that an application has been received for a Class "A" Liquor Licence from the Blue Button Club, which is a proposed private club for Local 40, the Hotel and Restaraunt Employee's Union. The location of the proposed club is at the rear of a large commercial building at the north west corner of Canada Way and Smith Avenue. The applicant has indicated they wish to obtain approval for 225 licenced seats with hours of operation being 11:00 a.m. to 1:00 a.m. seven days per week.

The Municipal Manager recommended:

AND WHEREAS Canadian Forces have been deployed to the Persian Gulf and will conduct sea/land control and surveillance duties in the Persian Gulf areas;

AND WHEREAS the threat of nuclear and chemical warfare has escalated dramatically in the Persian Gulf area;

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT Burnaby Council support the United Nations efforts to bring about a peaceful resolution to the Iraq invasion of Kuwait;

AND FURTHER BE IT RESOLVED THAT Council forward this recommendation to the Right Honourable Brian Mulroney, Prime Minister of Canada, Leaders of the New Democratic Party and Liberal Party and Burnaby Members of Parliament."



Following are comments from the Acting Chief Public Health Inspector regarding the last line in the attachment to Mr. Strachan's letter regarding runoff from public roads:

"The impact to Burrard Inlet of salting of roads is considered insignificant due to the fact that the receiving water is saline. Furthermore, in other areas of Burnaby where salting of roads results in runoff entering fresh waters, the impact is also not considered significant due to the infrequent use of salt on roads and the nature of westcoast weather (rain and mild temperatures) which results in increased dilution of the road salt. The federal and provincial environmental agencies that were contacted concur with this conclusion."

Staff have discussed this matter with Mr. Strachan.


 Metro Centre Hotel, 1990 December 27,
 Re: Proposed Licensed Retail Beer and Wine Store at Holiday Inn Metrotown

A letter dated 1990 December 27 was received from the Metro Centre Hotel expressing concern about the possibility of Holiday Inn being granted a licenced retail Beer and Wine Store licence which would affect the application submitted by the Metro Centre Hotel.

A staff notation appended to this item of correspondence advises that on 1989 July 24 Council referred back to staff a report on Rezoning Reference #94/88 which involves the Metro Centre Hotel's request for a Beer and Wine Store; Staff on that occasion was asked to relate the proposal to the owner's longterm plans for the site.

While a comprehensive development plan has not yet been finalized by the owner, he has recently requested that his Beer and Wine Store application proceed based on the facility being temporary. A report will be submitted to Council in the near future on this request.

Council will recall that staff were recently directed to provide information on the guidelines for assessing retail Beer and Wine Stores and a plot of liquor facilities in Metrotown. This information will be submitted to Council for consideration on 1991 January 14.

#### NOTICE OF MOTION

1. ALDERMAN D.A. LAWSON

Re: Clean-up of Urban Pollution

Flowing Into Waterways

Alderman Lawson was granted leave by Council to present the following resolution:

MOVED BY ALDERMAN LAWSON: SECONDED BY ALDERMAN DRUMMOND:

THAT WHEREAS the Municipality of Burnaby and the Greater Vancouver Regional District have plans for, studies underway, or concerns for the cleanup of urban pollution flowing into our waterways, and;

WHEREAS some of our aging infrastructure in northwest and southeast Burnaby has combined water and sewer pipes which spew raw sewage directly into Burrard Inlet and the Fraser River during rain storms at frequencies between 100 and 150 times annually in the inlet and 80 to 100 times annually in the river, and:

WHEREAS all storm sewer lines carry storm water runoff, which includes automobile gas and oil and other contaminants dropped onto roads and highways, and then empty into creeks and streams or directly into Burrard Inlet, the Fraser River, and the Deer Lake-Still Creek-Burnaby Lake-Brunette River system, and;

WHEREAS, because it is anticipated that our regional district's population will grow by approximately 300,000 people in the next 10 years, the need to prevent pollution of our waterways becomes even more urgent;



THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT Staff prepare a report on Burnaby and/or Greater Vancouver Regional District action, plans, and studies, both short and long range, designed to contribute to the cleanup of our polluted waters, particularly in the area of:

- 1. Prevention of combined sanitary and water sewage systems overflows which spew raw sewage into Burrard Inlet and the Fraser River during rainstorms, and
- 2. The effects of storm water runoff pollution to Burrard Inlet, Fraser River and the Deer Lake-Still Creek-Burnaby Lake-Brunette River system, and
- 3. Steps which can be taken to mitigate the effects of urban storm water pollution on local receiving waters, i.e. changes in design standards, bylaws, etc.

#### CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY

2. Alderman Drummond introduced the following resolution which will be presented to Council for consideration at the 1991 January 21 regular Council Meeting:

#### 1991 PROVISIONAL OPERATING BUDGET

WHEREAS it is a requirement of the Municipal Act that Council adopt a provisional budget not later than the third Monday after January 01, (January 21);

AND WHEREAS Council, on 1990 December 10, tabled the Municipal Manager's recommendation "THAT the 1991 Provisional Operating Budget be adopted", to provide an opportunity for Council to meet with the Municipal Manager and the Management Committee to find ways of reducing the proposed 1991 expenditures to a more acceptable level;

AND WHEREAS Municipal Council approved a motion requesting that staff hold off the hiring of any new positions until 1991 June, with the exception of the Re-cycling Vehicle Operators and new positions which do not translate into budget increases;

AND WHEREAS more time is required for Council and the Management Committee to review and amend the proposed 1991 operating expenditures;

**THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT** Council lift this item from the table and adopt the Municipal Manager's recommendation, "THAT the 1991 Provisional Operating Budget be adopted", with the following conditions:

- 1. THAT expenditures from the provisional budget be delayed where possible, and otherwise held to a minimum until the 1991 Annual Operating Budget is adopted by Council in May.
- 2. THAT the hiring of any new positions be put on hold until 1991 July, with the exception of the Re-cycling Vehicle Operators.
- 3. THAT justification for all new positions to be created in 1991 be presented to Council in a separate report prior to the positions being considered in the 1991 Annual Operating Budget.
- 4. THAT existing services and programs be re-evaluated to ensure that they remain a priority for municipal expenditure.
- 5. THAT staff, boards and commissions accept as an objective for the 1991 Annual Operating Budget that the general municipal property tax increase on the median home will be no more than the 1991 rate of inflation.



#### NEW BUSINESS

#### Alderman Corrigan

Alderman Corrigan described various complaints received about the Provincially maintained roadways throughout the Municipality during the recent snow storm. Alderman Corrigan cited problems with Highway 1, portions of Canada Way, Hastings Street, Marine Way, Lougheed Highway and Kingsway.
