The proposed program would mitigate long standing agricultural drainage problems and recurring flooding problems in low lying areas, and would offer opportunities for fisheries enhancement in major water courses. Program improvements outlined for 1991 include improvements to Nelson Creek, Hollis Creek, Williard/Thorne, Marine Drive and dyking for the Big Bend area.

Alderman Young advised that he is in receipt of correspondence from Murray Dykeman, Vancouver Regional Transit Commission requesting Council support amendments to the transit funding formula to reflect the Commissions' principles. The funding formula amendments would result in increases to Transit Commission revenues of approximately 23.8%.

The proposed funding formula amendment would result in an average fare increase of 8%, a Provincial increase in fuel tax of approximately 1% per litre, a monthly hydro levy increase of approximately 19% and a non-resident property tax increase averaging 5%.
