5. Risk Analysis of Tanker Traffic
Movements within the Port of Vancouver

The Municipal Manager submitted a report from the Director Planning and Building Inspection providing Council with information on the risk analysis study completed for the Port of Vancouver. The report outlines the contents and highlights of the Risk Analysis Report and describes the public review process for the risk analysis. Implications of the report findings for Burnaby are included in the report.

7. Moscrop/Gilpin Urban Trail

The Municipal Manager submitted a report from the Director Planning and Building Inspection outlining a proposal for an urban trail to be coordinated with the development of the Moscrop/Gilpin Connector. The proposed route alignment is 3.2 kilometers in length and utilizes existing rights-of-way parallel to the Moscrop/Gilpin Connector. In addition, the proposed route will minimize the impacts on Deer Lake Park and can be developed in conjunction with Phase I of the Connector.

Development of the proposed urban trail will provide an alternate transportation route that will access several major facilities including B.C.I.T., Deer Lake Park, the Municipal Hall Complex and two high schools.

The Municipal Manager recommended:

1. THAT Council approve the proposal as outlined in this report for the Urban Trail connecting Willingdon Avenue to Deer Lake Place to be implemented in conjunction with the development of the Moscrop/Gilpin Connector.
