

5. Asian Gypsy Moth Control Program

The Municipal Manager submitted a report from the Director Recreation and Cultural Services requesting Council's endorsement and support for the Federal Department of Agriculture proposed program to eradicate the Asian Gypsy Moth which was detected in the areas surrounding the Port of Vancouver in 1991 August. The Federal Department of Agriculture intends to conduct a public consultation process early in 1992. Following this process, it is the intent of Agriculture Canada to commence an aerial spraying program using BT (Bacillus Thuringiensis) to eradicate the moth.

The Municipal Manager recommended:

1. THAT Council support a Federal Department of Agriculture program to eradicate the Asian Gypsy Moth subject to the outcome of the public consultation meetings and the issuance of a pesticide application permit by the B.C. Ministry of Environment.

- 3. THAT a copy of this report be sent to the GVRD and the office of the Solid Waste Management Plan Review for information.


The Municipal Manager submitted a report from the Director Planning and Building Inspection requesting Council authority to forward the subject rezoning application to a Public Hearing on 1992 January 28. The purpose of the proposed rezoning bylaw amendment is to permit the construction of a single family dwelling with the floor area greater than that permitted under the prevailing residential zoning.

The Municipal Manager recommended:

- 1. THAT a Rezoning Bylaw be prepared and advanced to First Reading on 1992 January 06 and to a Public Hearing on 1992 January 28 at 7:30 p.m., and that the following be established as prerequisites to the completion of the rezoning:
 - a) The submission of a suitable plan of development reflecting a compatible relationship with the surrounding neighbourhood.
 - b) The owner enter into a covenant certifying that the land shall be developed only in accordance with the plan submitted.

The Municipal Manager submitted a report from the Director Planning and Building Inspection requesting Council authority to forward the subject rezoning application to a Public Hearing on 1992 January 28. The purpose of the proposed rezoning bylaw amendment is to permit the development of a 24 unit, 3 1/2 storey townhouse project.

The Municipal Manager recommended:

- 1. THAT a rezoning bylaw be prepared and advanced to First Reading on 1992 January 06 and to a Public Hearing on 1992 January 28 at 7:30 p.m.
- 2. THAT the following be established as prerequisites to the completion of the rezoning:
 - a) The submission of a suitable plan of development.
 - b) The deposit of sufficient monies to cover the costs of all services necessary to serve the site and the completion of a servicing agreement covering all requisite services. All services are to be designed to Municipal standards and constructed in accordance with the Engineering Design. One of the conditions for the release of occupancy permits will be the completion of all requisite services.
 - c) The installation of all electrical, telephone and cable servicing, and all other wiring underground throughout the development, and to the point of connection to the existing service where sufficient facilities are available to serve the development.
 - d) The submission of an undertaking to remove all existing improvements from the site within six months of the rezoning being effected but not prior to Third Reading of the Bylaw. In the event that existing improvements on the site are vacant and considered to be unsafe, unstable, and a hazard to life, the Fire Prevention Office may recommend immediate demolition of such improvements and removal of the resultant debris prior to Third Reading.
 - e) The consolidation of the net project site into one legal parcel.
 - f) The granting of any necessary easements.
 - g) The dedication of any rights-of-way deemed requisite.
 - h) The undergrounding of existing overhead wiring abutting the site.
 - i) All applicable condominium guidelines as adopted by Council shall be adhered to by the applicant.
 - j) Compliance with the Council-adopted sound criteria.
 - k) The provision of an adequately sized and appropriately located garbage handling and recycling material holding space with the underground parking and a commitment to implement the recycling provisions.
 - The deposit of the applicable per unit Neighbourhood Parkland Acquisition Charge.
 - m) The completion of the sale of municipal property.
 - n) The granting of a 215 covenant restricting enclosure of balconies.

MOVED BY ALDERMAN DRUMMOND: SECONDED BY ALDERMAN EVANS:

In the event that exisiting improvements on the site are vacant and considered to be unsafe, unstable, and a hazard to life, the Fire Prevention Office may recommend immediate demolition of such improvements and removal of the resultant debris prior to Third Reading.
 - e) The granting of any necessary easements.
 - f) The undergrounding of existing overhead wiring abutting the site.
 - g) All applicable condominium guidelines as adopted by Council shall be adhered to by the applicant.
 - h) The deposit of the applicable per unit Neighbourhood Parkland Acquisition Charge.
 - i) The granting of a 215 covenant restricting enclosure of balconies.
