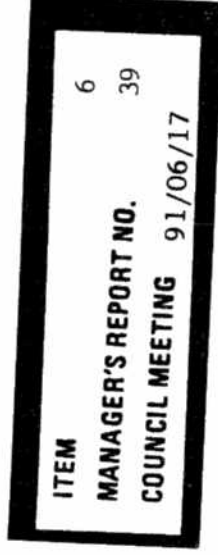
60 30 079 Gilmore Avenue Sanitary Sewer  
Pump Station Replacement

Charge: 1991 - 1995 Capital Budget \$700,000  
Code 30, Sanitary Extensions

Additional Information

Appearing elsewhere on the Council Agenda is an item recommending award of Contract No. 9118 for the replacement of a Sewage Pumping Station located at Gilmore Avenue/Dawson Street. The existing station has reached the end of its useful life and is subject to frequent malfunctions and high maintenance cost.

Total estimated project cost, including construction supervision, and other auxiliary work by Municipal forces is \$700,000. Sufficient funds are available in the 1991 - 1995 Capital Budget, Code 30, Sanitary Sewer Extensions.

Additional Information

Soil conditions on the Westminster Avenue road link between Still Creek Street and Regent Street consist essentially of extremely sensitive and highly compressible soils that require "pre-loading" prior to final road construction. The "pre-load", which has been in place for several months has resulted in significant settlement. This work order pertains to the supply and placement of additional fill material necessary to continue the settlement process. It is our intention to complete the road link to an interim standard once this initial settlement has taken place. Estimated cost of the continued "pre-loading" is \$30,000, funds for which are available in the 1991 - 1995 Capital Budget, Code 70, Land Assembly and Development.
