4. Mike Brown, 1991 October 15, Re: Potential for serious incident at

Burlington Northern Railway tracks at Cariboo Road

A letter dated 1991 October 15 was received from Mike Brown expressing concern with regard to a tendency on the part of some drivers to dodge the barrier gates at the railway crossing at Cariboo Road and Government Street. Mr. Brown is concerned that an accident resulting from this type of behaviour could cause a dangerous chemical spill and is requesting information as to the state of Burnaby's readiness for such an accident.

His Worship, Mayor W.J. Copeland read a memorandum from the Municipal Manager prepared in response to this item of correspondence advising that the Municipality is presently working with Burlington Northern Railway to improve the railway warning system at this crossing. Presently, the time that the crossing gates close ahead of the arrival of the train varies from 30 second to 150 seconds, depending upon the approach speed of the train. The train sensing equipment will be upgraded to provide a constant 30 second warning, which is the railway standard, regardless of the speed of the train. The Municipality is also in the process of installing traffic signals at the intersection of Cariboo Road and Government Street, immediately north of the railway, which will be programmed to stay red for northbound traffic during a train crossing. This will discourage drivers from driving around the barrier gates. Mr. Brown will be apprised of these remedial measures that are being taken at this location.

As to Burnaby's readiness to respond to a major chemical accident, the Acting Chief Public Health inspector will personally contact Mr. Brown and orally provide him with information on the measures that would be taken by the Municipality in such a situation. The Municipality has other plans that will enable an effective response to be taken with regard to any type of emergency that could occur in Burnaby, and Mr. Brown will be apprised of these response plans as well.
