COMMENTS ON CRIME TRENDS AND POLICING PROBLEMS:

The following summarizes policing activities for Burnaby Detachment

TRAFFIC SECTION - There were no fatal motor vehicle accidents this quarter, they attended 563 injury accidents. Breathalyser test were conducted on 109 subjects with applicable charges. This Section continues with seat-belt enforcement, to help reduce personal injuries. With the schools in the area closed for summer holidays, heavier enforcement is expected at intersections and playground areas.

GENERAL INVESTIGATION SECTION - They are currently investigating an arson fire to the ASPARMONTE CAFE in the 4300 block of Hastings. This fire resulted in the death of an elderly female tenant who resided in an apartment above the cafe.

Charges are being laid as a result of the investigation into the large Jewellery Store Robbery on North Rd.

A large amount of counterfeit Canadian \$100 bills have surfaced in our area, several charges have been laid for possession of these bills.

Armed Robberies and Auto Thefts are still a problem.

FORENSIC IDENT SECTION - During June, Forensic Ident Section were involved in 134 calls. The majority of these were from a combination of residential Break & Enters, or theft from Autos. Thirteen criminals were identified most of them to residential break-ins.

DRUG SECTION - Drug Section has remained committed on preparation for an up coming major cocaine conspiracy trial.

In June members assisted L.M.R.C.C. Liaison, conduct searches at the new Women's Prison, on visitors suspected of carrying narcotics into the prison. No seizures were made.

Also in June, members conducted an undercover operation on an after hours bootlegging operation and purchased 24 beer and then seized an additional 16 dozen beer and a case of hard liquor. Suspects were delivering the orders and charging \$10 over liquor store prices. One (1) male to be charged with illegal sale of liquor.

Members assisted "D" Watch General Duty execute an Narcotic Control Act Search Warrant on a Burnaby residence and seized eleven marihuana plants with an approximate street value of \$13,750.00.

Members remain very busy with files from concerned citizens or Crimestoppers.

During the latter part of June Drug Section assisted Vancouver City Police dismantle a marihuana grow operation in a Burnaby residence. A total of 209 marihuana plants, 1 lb. of dried marihuana, scales and sheets indicating sales of marihuana. Approximate street value of seized plants and marihuana is \$160,000. One Burnaby resident to be charged with Section 4 (2) NCA - PPT marihuana and Section 6 (1) N.C.A. - Cultivation.
