- 3. Mr. Joe Valdez, Vancouver, B.C. appeared before Council to express support for the Burnaby Boxing Club.


Mr. Valdez expressed appreciation to the Municipality, particularly Kate Friars of the Parks and Recreation Department for obtaining facilities for the boxing club.

Mr. Valdez noted that approximately \$4,500 is required to upgrade equipment for the club and requested Council's continued support for this organization.

The Council Committee of the Whole submitted a report providing an overview of the 1991 Annual Operating Budget. The budget as presented results in tax increases for the various property classes including:

- 3.9% for residential, recreation and farm;
- 5.9% for business;
- 7.5% for light industry;
- 9.9% for major industry; and
- 11.0% for utilities.

The budget maintains the level of services delivered in previous years and also provides for service improvements primarily in the areas of recycling, environmental management and recreation.

The uncertainty of negotiations with regard to the R.C.M.P. and C.U.P.E. collective bargaining, coupled with a desire to show restraint over expenditures has led the Committee to recommend a moratorium on the hiring of new regular full-time staff positions.

The Council Committee of the Whole recommended:

- 2. THAT a moratorium be placed on the hiring of future new staff positions with the exception of six RCMP clerical staff, four of which are to be hired after July 01 and two after November 01.
