The speaker advised that 180 seniors signed up for the driver education program and of that 137 completed both halves of the courses offered.

Mr. Fourchalk advised that it has become increasingly important to seniors to drive safely and maintain their driver's licences. Arising from the week's activities more than 100 requests were received to conduct follow up courses and as a result courses have been scheduled through to September.

The speaker concluded by reiterating his appreciation to the municipality and its citizens for their support for Mature Driving Week.

Alderman Redman entered the Council Chamber at 7:06~p.m. and took her place at the Council table.

2. Mr. Peter Walker, Walker Productions appeared before Council to provide additional information on the proposed environmental concern at Oakalla.

Mr. Walker advised that he has conducted a survey of the area and of the residents surveyed, 228 expressed support for the concern with only 8 in opposition. The speaker noted that in response to concerns of area residents, liquor will not be served during this event.

The speaker advised that Michael J. Fox will act as Master of Ceremonies for the event, the Beach Boys will play for one and a half hours, from 4:00 to 5:30 p.m. and that the event will conclude promptly at 6:00 p.m., with everyone leaving the premises by 6:30 p.m. No on site parking will be permitted and 15 shuttle buses will provide service to the site from parking areas in Metrotown, the PNE Park N Ride and B.C.I.T.

 Proposed Use of Oakalla Site for A Concert and Other Events

The following item was tabled at the regular Council Meeting held on 1991 June 24:

23. Proposed Use of the Oakalla Site for a Concert and other Events

The Municipal Manager submitted a report providing Council with information on a proposal by Walker Productions to hold a concert and to conduct public tours of the Oakalla prison on Sunday, 1991 September 15. In order to grant permission to hold such an event, certain issues will have to be considered by the event organizers. These issues would include the provision of an insurance and performance bond in the amount of \$5 million; a municipal business licence; a Provincial liquor licence; adherence to the Burnaby Noise and Sound Abatement Bylaw; the prevention of access to Deer Lake Park through the existing Oakalla lands; control of the impact on the immediate residential neighbourhoods; management of traffic and provision of transportation and parking facilities; assumption of municipal costs for additional requirements for R.C.M.P.; compliance with all health regulations regarding food service and the disposal of wastes; compliance with all fire regulations; provision of on-site security; and a maximum attendance of 25,000 persons.

The Municipal Manager recommended:

- 1. THAT Council support the proposal from Walker Productions subject to full compliance with all Municipal regulations and conditions as more specifically referred to in this report, and subject further to an agreement between staff and Walker Productions on the maximum number of persons who would be allowed to attend the event as more fully explained in this report.
- 2. THAT a copy of this report be sent to Mr. Peter Walker, Walker Productions, 3762 Nico Wynd Drive, Surrey, B.C., V5A 5E7.

A vote was then taken on the motion as moved by Alderman Drummond and seconded by Alderman Evans, being 'THAT the recommendations of the Municipal Manager be adopted,' and same was **CARRIED** with Mayor W.J. Copeland, Aldermen Evans, Lawson, Rankin and Redman FOR the motion and Aldermen Corrigan, Drummond, Nikolai and Young OPPOSED to the motion.

3. Jennifer Laidley, 5470 Hardwick Street, Burnaby, B.C. appeared before Council to express concern that the British Columbia Public Interest Research Group, Simon Fraser University Branch has not been consulted in the planning of the proposed domed stadium at S.F.U.

The group's concerns include whether or not an environmental impact assessment will be undertaken and the effect of the development on Naheeno Park, the community garden and the forest-eco system.

The speaker outlined concerns surrounding the impact on wildlife habitat, air pollution, noise pollution and the negative impact of the loss of Alder trees on area plant life.

Ms. Laidley concluded by requesting Council postpone approval of the project until Simon Fraser University administration have met and reviewed concerns with the groups affected.

- 4. Mr. Darryl Lucas, 823 555 Cottonwood Avenue, Coquitlam and Bonita Bell-Richards appeared before Council to support construction of a domed stadium at S.F.U. The speakers advised Council of the number of athletic groups forced to utilize off campus sports facilities due to a lack of on campus facilities and reiterated their support for the development.
- 5. Mr. Steven Coates, University Liaison Officer, Simon Fraser Student Association appeared before Council to advise that the administration at S.F.U. have not consulted the Student Society with regard to the proposal to construct a domed stadium.

The speaker advised that there are several groups which should have been consulted before the plan was brought before Council. These groups include the Burnaby Mountain Preservation Society, Louis Riel Tenants Association and the Simon Fraser University Garden Club.

Ms. Tobie Myers, Executive Officer, Simon Fraser University Student Society advised that there are several groups competing for space at S.F.U.; academics, athletics and residents. The use of land for the sports facilities limits the ability of other services to expand. The Student Society is also concerned about the costs involved in construction and operation of the facility, the impact on traffic and the impact on conservation lands outside the ring road.

The speakers concluded by requesting Council not support the proposal until the University administration have consulted with the various groups and reported the results of these consultations back to Council.

Alderman Drummond retired from the Council Chamber at 8:20 p.m.

6. Mr. Dean Lamont, 311 - E. 39th Avenue, Vancouver, B.C. appeared before Council on behalf of the Burnaby Mountain Preservation Society to express concerns with regard to construction of the domed stadium at S.F.U.

Mr. Lamont advised that his concerns surround social and environmental issues and feels that a variety of groups should have been consulted before proceeding with the plan. Mr. Lamont's environmental concerns include clear cutting an area equivalent to four football fields and the subsequent pressure placed on lands in the conservation area once lands within the ring road have been developed.

The speaker suggested the current plant be eliminated and the University administration meet with concerned groups to discuss a new proposal.

Alderman Nikolai retired from the Council Chamber at 8:35 p.m.

Alderman Redman retired from the Council Chamber at 8:36 p.m.

7. Mr. Nathan Davidowicz, 2924 E. 41st Avenue, Vancouver, B.C. appeared before Council to express support for the relocation of the Burnaby fare zone boundary to North Road as a number one transit priority in Burnaby.

Alderman Drummond returned to the Council Chamber at 8:40 p.m. and took his place at the Council table.

The speaker brought forward a variety of requests submitted to B.C. Transit by Burnaby Council in 1988 which have not yet been addressed.

Alderman Rankin retired from the Council Chamber at 8:45 p.m.

Mr. Davidowicz requested the unaddressed items be resubmitted to B.C. Transit as part of the current requests being submitted under the 1992/93 Annual Service Plan.

Alderman Corrigan retired from the Council Chamber at 8:50 p.m.

The Association supports the Loughed/Broadway Corridor but advocates undergrounding of the route from the Hastings/Boundary intersection to Glen Drive and Hastings where it would emerge to an above ground guideway to the Vancouver waterfront. The speaker outlined various benefits of the proposal and concluded by requesting Council support the Lougheed, Broadway, Hastings, waterfront route.

Alderman Rankin returned to the Council Chamber at 9:10 p.m. and took his place at the Council table.

Alderman Lawson returned to the Council Chamber at 9:10 p.m. and took her place at the Council table.

His Worship, Mayor W.J. Copeland requested leave of Council to introduce an additional delegation, that being the Simon Fraser University Garden Club, who wish to address Council in regard to the proposed domed stadium at S.F.U.

8A. Simon Fraser University Garden Club, Re: Proposed Simon Fraser University Domed Stadium Speaker - Gail Lynn Hall

Ms. Gail Lynn Hall appeared before Council as a member of the Simon Fraser University Garden Club to express opposition to the proposed domed stadium at S.F.U. Ms. Hall outlined the various activities which take place on the land allotted to the Garden Club and the threat imposed by the proposed construction. In conclusion, the speaker requested that Council withhold approval of the project until the administration meets with representatives of the Garden Club.

"There have been several requests in recent years, by various groups, to permit the temporary installation of cold and hot air balloon signs in the Municipality for advertising purposes. In each case applicants were informed that such inflatable air balloons incorporating advertising constitute signs and that this type of sign display was not permitted by the Burnaby Sign Bylaw.

On 1988 November 22 staff submitted a report to Council as a result of a request by Be.Ceen Inflatable Advertising Inc. to amend the Sign Bylaw in order to include balloon-type signs. Staff at that time concluded that it would not be in the Municipality's best interest to amend the Bylaw. This conclusion was supported by Council."

The municipal suggestions include a more direct express bus service from North Burnaby to downtown Vancouver; revision of the North Burnaby local routes to emphasize connections with the new Hastings diesel express service; development of a South Burnaby/New Westminster Area Plan for implementation in the 1993 fiscal year; introduction of small buses on appropriate routes in North and South Burnaby; extension of the trolley overhead from Boundary Road via Lougheed Highway to Brentwood Town Centre; assessment of transit changes required to improve access to the Municipal Hall area and the relocation of the northeast Burnaby fare zone boundary to North Road.
