

REPORT

This year's Canadian Parks and Recreation Association National Conference is being held in Regina, August 11 - 15.

The Commission and senior staff are members of this National Association and over the years have actively participated in the Association Conferences. The Superintendent Community Recreation will be this years' staff representative.

This year, the focus of the Conference is the global issues of Environment, Cross Cultural Relations and Urbanization and their influence on local provisions of Recreation and Parks services.

These issues are directly relevant to our recreation issues in Burnaby. To gain a broad perspective on these issues will be directly beneficial to our ability to effectively approach our local Recreation and Park challenges.

The estimated cost for full participation in this conference is \$1,300. Funds are available in the Parks and Recreation budget.
