The speaker advised that he has been in contact with the Vancouver Poundkeeper who notes that since adoption of the Vancouver City Vicious Dog Bylaw pit bull problems have decreased by 75%. Mr. McCurrach would like Burnaby Council to adopt a vicious dog definition similiar to that utilized by the City of Vancouver.

2. Mr. Johnry Lee, 640 Slocan Street, Vancouver, B.C. appeared before Council as co-owner of property at 4315-4323 East Hastings Street in Burnaby.

Mr. Lee is requesting that the requirement to provide a public walkway through subject property be eliminated. The property owners were unaware of this requirement until after a proposal to redevelop the site was put forward to the Planning Department.

The speaker sited problems with vandalism, loss of privacy, noise, litter, extra maintenance and parking as disadvantages to providing the walkway.

Mr. Eigel Lyngen, 1861 Welsh Street, North Vancouver, B.C., architect for the development site, advised that the pedestrian pass-through was an unecessary component of the area plan. Mr. Lyngren noted that it would be preferable to have pedestrians walk along the main street rather than in service lanes.

The report provides background information on the preparation of detailed new zoning regulations for the existing C3, C4, C6B and R5 zoned areas which should be submitted to Council in the near future. These regulations propose as a condition of use the provison of a public pedestrian walkway on a registered statutory right of way that links Hastings Street with the parallel lane, is at least 3 metres wide and may be built over to half its depth, unless an intersection or an existing walkway already exists within 45.78 metres of the centre of the property.

Unless otherwise directed, staff propose to continue working with the applicant toward creating a suitable plan of development incorporating the walkway and associated F.A.R. and parking benefits.
