REPORT OF THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

A meeting of the Executive Committee of Council was held on 1992 May 19 to consider the following grant applications and submit the following majority recommendations for Council's approval:

46/92 BIG BROTHERS OF GREATER VANCOUVER

RECOMMENDATION:

1. THAT a grant in the amount of \$10,000 be awarded to Big Brothers of Greater Vancouver for 1992 to cover the cost of rent, tax and utilities on their Burnaby facility with the balance to cover operating expenses.

R E P O R T

An application has been received from the Big Brothers of Greater Vancouver requesting a renewal of their grant for fiscal year 1992/93.

Council in 1989, 1990 and 1991 awarded a grant to Big Brothers of Greater Vancouver in the amount of \$10,000 with the proviso that \$5,000 cover rent, tax and utilities on a facility on 7443 Edmonds Street and the remaining \$5,000 cover operating expenses.

The Executive Committee of Council recommends approval of a grant for the 1992/93 operating year in the amount of \$10,000 with the proviso that the rent, tax and utilities for the municipal building be paid from these funds.

47/92 PTARMIGAN MUSIC AND THEATRE SOCIETY

RECOMMENDATION

1. THAT this grant application be denied.

R E P O R T

A letter of application was received requesting a grant in the amount of \$5,000 to assist with costs for 15 performances of Educational Historical shows that are scheduled to be performed at Elementary and High schools in Burnaby. Ptarmigan Music and Theatre Society is a non-profit organization that has performed in schools and museums in British Columbia and Alberta for the past 12 years.

Although recognizing the valuable work the Society performs, the Executive Committee of Council recommends that this grant application be denied.

34/92 BURNABY MULTICULTURAL SOCIETY

RECOMMENDATION:

1. THAT a grant in the amount of \$500 be awarded to the Burnaby Multicultural Society in the amount of \$500 for Project Xenophilia.

R E P O R T

As one of its Centennial activities the Burnaby Multicultural Society in conjunction with the Burnaby School Board is sponsoring Project Xenophilia which will begin through Burnaby School system on 1992 May 04 and will continue for the remainder of that month.

The purpose of the project is to familiarize the students in a positive way with the concept and experience of diversity within our community. Xenophilia means being congenial towards people from elsewhere. The project will have two aspects - for the younger children it will be a graphic activity. They will be asked to draw their concept of the town and citizens; for the older children it will be a literary one. They will be asked to write an essay on Xenophilia. There will be first, second and third prizes in each category. Prizes will be presented on 1992 June 21 and the Fathers Day Walk-A-Thon Burnaby Lake Park. The winning essays will be bound and catalogued in the main library and the winning graphic will be displayed there or in a prominent mall.

The Executive Committee of Council recommends that a grant in the amount of \$500 be awarded to the Burnaby Multicultural Society for Project Xenophilia.

21/92 METRO SENIORS BAND SOCIETY

RECOMMENDATION:


1. THAT a grant in the amount of \$400 be awarded as a one time only grant to the Metro Seniors Band Society for the year 1992.

An application was received requesting a grant to assist with expenses for music, uniforms, repairs, insurance and the possible procurement of a portable P.A. system.
