

1. Mr. Denis Zlmmer, 7643 Cariboo Road, Burnaby, B.C. appeared before Council requesting permission to purchase the lane directly behind his property.

The speaker distributed a map of the property outlining the current pedestrian overpass and demonstrating present difficulties with access and parking. Prior to construction of the overpass the speaker had access from 15th Avenue, however, this access was eliminated after the overpass was constructed.

Mr. Zimmer concluded by reiterating his request to purchase the lane right-of-way.

The speaker was then provided with an opportunity to review Item 2 of the City Manager's Report prepared in response to his request to purchase the lane right-of-way.

2. Mr. Douglas Porter, 3782 Thurston Street, Burnaby, B.C. appeared before Council to express his views with respect to a proposed apartment development at 3754 and 3762 Thurston Street.

Mr. Porter questioned the need to widen and upgrade this portion of Thurston Street and expressed a desire to keep the street narrow to encourage pedestrian traffic instead of vehicular traffic. The speaker then raised concerns regarding the impact of the construction on trees on the property and whether or not problems would result which would necessitate removal of the trees.

Mr. Porter addressed the Heritage aspects of the site and requested consideration be given to retaining the former Thurston Street Shoe Factory on the property.

in conclusion, Mr. Porter discussed the negative personal impact and stresses which he feels have been created by redevelopment in his neighbourhood and requested Council take into consideration the impact of this development on his personal well-being when making decisions on this rezoning application.

4. Rezoning Reference #8/92 3754 and 3762 Thurston Street Lots 7 & 8 Exc. S. 20' (Expl. Pi. 6892), D.L. 35, Pian 1198

The City Manager submitted a report from the Acting Director Pianning and Building prepared in response to an application for a rezoning which would allow construction of a new four storey rental apartment and the relocation, restoration and reuse of the Thurston House located on the site, which would be utilized for residential units plus a four bed group home.

The City Manager recommended:

- 1. THAT this report be referred to the Heritage Advisory Committee for information.
- 2. THAT a Rezoning Bylaw be prepared and advanced to First Reading on 1992 October 05 and to a Public Hearing on 1992 October 27.
- 3. THAT the following be established as prerequisites to the completion of the rezoning:
 - a) The submission of a suitable plan of development.
 - b) The deposit of sufficient monies to cover the costs of ail services necessary to serve the site and the completion of a servicing agreement covering all requisite services. All services are to be designed to Municipal standards and constructed in accordance with the Engineering Design. One of the conditions for the release of occupancy permits will be the completion of all requisite services.
 - c) The installation of all electrical, telephone and cable servicing, and all other wiring underground throughout the development, and to the point of connection to the existing service where sufficient facilities are available to serve the development.
 - d) The consolidation of the net project site into one legal
 - e) The granting of any necessary easements.
 - f) The dedication of any rights-of-way deemed requisite.
 - h) Completion of a restrictive covenant to protect the groupings of mature trees at the southwest corner and along the southern edge of the property.
 - g) The undergrounding of existing overhead wiring abutting the site.

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- h) The retention of as many existing mature trees as possible on the site and submission of a written undertaking to ensure that all site areas identified for preservation of existing vegetation are effectively protected by snow fencing or other approved physical containment during the whole course of site preparation and construction work.
- i) Compliance with the Council adopted sound criteria.
- j) The provision of an adequately sized and appropriately located garbage handling and recycling material holding space within the underground parking and a commitment to implement the recycling provisions.
- k) The deposit of the applicable per unit Neighbourhood Parkland Acquisition Charge.
- i) The submission of a letter from the owners of the property confirming that they intend to relocate the house on the site and restore the exterior of the heritage building utilizing the original windows, exterior finish materials and construction details and that they will support the heritage designation of the building by bylaw.
- m) The submission of a letter from B.C.H.M.C. or the Ministry of Health confirming that the City will be consulted during the process to ensure that the group home is utilized in a manner which is compatible with the adjacent family housing and the surrounding neighbourhood.

The developer advised that they are proposing ten units to be adaptable to handicapped use and are working with the Vancouver Resource Centre to ensure development of an appropriate facility.

Mr. Sheiton requested Council authorize staff to work with the applicant towards a Public Hearing in 1993 January and the issuance of a development permit by 1993 April 01.

The speaker reiterated their plans for the development and their desire to contribute to a more pedestrian friendly environment in this neighbourhood.

 Request to Purchase Lane Allowance For Consolidation with 7643 Cariboo Road to Provide Vehicular Access to Fifteenth Avenue

The City Manager submitted a report from Acting Director Planning and Building prepared in response to a request to purchase a lane allowance for consolidation with 7643 Cariboo Road. Staff advise that the proposal to gain vehicular access to 15th Avenue from the Cariboo Road property is contrary to the 1986 Community Plan and would conflict with pedestrian access from the south side of 15th Avenue and the subject lane to the overpass. Elimination of the lane allowance would remove direct access to the overpass for the majority of the Monroe and Armstrong Avenue residents. As a result, staff do not support the request to purchase the lane allowance.

1. THAT Council advise the applicant that the subject lane allowance is required for pedestrian access to the Cariboo Road overpass and is, therefore, not available for sale.

A letter dated 1992 September 08 was received from the Minister of Transportation and Highways, addressed to Mr. Cecii E. Bund responding to a request for larger and clearer traffic signs throughout the Lower Mainland. The Minister has referred Mr. Bund's correspondence to the City because street signage on local streets is the responsibility of local government.

A staff notation appended to this item of correspondence advises that the Engineering Departments's current practice is to suspend additional, larger street name signs from signal davit arms (which generally coincide with major intersections). Older signal installations are being retrofitted as resources permit. Staff are monitoring the Coquitiam practice to determine whether internally illuminated signs are cost effective. The City Manager submitted a report from Acting Director Planning and Bullding prepared in response to correspondence from two residents of Duthie Avenue regarding a potential subdivision application for the creation of two new lots fronting on Greystone Drive from the rear portlons of the existing two lots which front on Duthie Avenue.

City staff advise that to date no new subdivision application has been received pertaining to the subject properties, but that if an application were submitted, the existing Community Pian 7 designation would not preclude its approval. However, there are other technical considerations to be examined before approval of the subdivision application could be considered.



AND WHEREAS the GVRD has projected an operating surplus in excess of \$5M in 1992;
