1. Mr. Gordon Rathbun, 8021 Brynlor Drive, Burnaby, B.C. appeared before Council to discuss the unopened road allowance connecting Brynlor Drive and Kern Avenue.

in addressing a previously prepared staff report, Mr. Rathbun advised that options three and four were unacceptable to area residents. Alternatively, the speaker suggested that barriers and a fire gate be placed at the end of Brynlor Drive once lot four is opened for development. The residents suggested that a no exit sign be placed in advance of the barriers near Caulwynd Place and Brynlor.

In addition, Mr. Rathbun is requesting a lane barrier on the northwest corner of the new iane to discourage through traffic.

The speaker concluded by submitting a petition containing 65 signatures expressing support for construction of a cul-de-sac at the north end of Brynlor Drive; however, Mr. Rathbun also advised that the petitioners would be satisfied with barricades as an alternative to the cul-de-sac.

Arising from the discussion Councillor Young was granted leave by Council to Introduce the following motion:

2. Mrs. Donna O'Neill, 8238 Brynlor Drive, Burnaby, B.C. appeared before Council to express support for retaining the unopened road allowance connecting Brynlor and Kern.

The speaker expressed concerns with regard to the safety of children, particularly on the southerly portion of Brynlor. Although Mrs. O'Neill did not express a preference for the manner in which Brynlor Drive is closed, she requested that it be neat and permanent.

3. Mr. R.L. Matthews, 6527 Portland Street, Burnaby, B.C. appeared before Council to express support for the closure of Brynlor Drive and the retention of current traffic patterns. The speaker is representing residents of Portland Street.

Mr. Matthews expressed the view that the three options available for closing Brynlor are not acceptable to all area residents. Although he agreed the proposal would satisfy the majority of residents, people living on the top end of Portland Street also need access to the Brynlor iane.

The speaker suggested that the lane feed into Kern Avenue with modifications to block the northwest corner and leave Kern Avenue unchanged. Mr. Matthews expressed appreciation to Council for their efforts to address the concerns of area residents.

Municipal staff advise that Sheil Canada was found guilty of a violation of Section 36(3) of the Fisheries Act and was fined the amount of \$65,000. Shell Canada has undertaken numerous actions subsequent to the spill to ensure that it does not occur again. The beach area was cleaned up to the satisfaction of Environment Canada and the Environmental Health Services and there were no oiled or dead fish found as a result of the spill.
