

RE: RIVERWAY GOLF COURSE - SALE OF ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES

RECOMMENDATION:

1. THAT Council be requested to approve the sale of alcoholic beverages (beer, cider and wine) at the Riverway Golf Course Coffee Shop.
2. THAT Council be asked to concur with an application for a Class "B" Liquor License for the Riverway Golf Course Coffee Shop.

REPORT

It is anticipated that the Coffee Shop at the Riverway Golf Course and Driving Range will be open to the public by 1993 July 01. Along with food and various refreshments to be served, it is also recommended that beer, cider and wine be available to the golfing public. A Class "B" Liquor License for Riverway will eventually be requested.

The Class "B" license to be requested would restrict the alcoholic beverages available to the aforementioned beer, cider and wine. Other details with respect to a Class "B" license are as follows:

- Food (i.e. a meal) must be purchased with any alcoholic beverage
- Minors are permitted to the licensed area
- Hours of operation shall be a maximum of 14 hours between 9am and 2am of the following day
- Beverages to be served and consumed in a designated space (i.e. alcoholic beverages not allowed on the Golf Course)

The availability of primarily beer, cider and wine would not be unusual in comparison to other public golf course restaurants. Alcoholic beverages are served at virtually all eighteen hole public golf facilities including Municipally operated courses such as Fraserview, McCleery, Langara (Vancouver - Class "B" licenses) and Gleneagles (West Vancouver). Beer, cider and wine are also available at Burnaby Mountain Golf Course through the operators at the Inn on the Green. Briefly, it is felt the golfing public would expect and appreciate these beverages to be available at the new facility.

Additionally, the funds derived from the sale of beer, cider and wine are also expected to be significant. In other golf oriented restaurant operations, the sale of these refreshments amounts to approximately 25% of overall gross revenues.

If approved, staff will ensure the necessary steps are taken to apply for and acquire a Class "B" Liquor License. As well, the equipment required to provide this service (i.e. draft beer dispenser) will be ordered and ready for operation within the required timeframe.
