SUBJECT: 1991 CENSUS OF POPULATION AND HOUSING (100% Data)
PURPOSE: To provide results from the 1991 Census released at the City wide level on age, sex, marital status, mother tongue and household and family relationships.

RECOMMENDATION:

1. **THAT** this report be received for information purposes.

REPORT

1.0 INTRODUCTION

1991 Census data based on the questionnaire sent to every household in Canada, has now been released at the Municipal level. This includes information on basic age, sex, marital status, mother tongue and household and family relationships.

Similar information will soon be made available for each of the 30 Census Tracts within the City.

Other variables, based on the cultural and economic questions asked of every fifth household are expected to be released in 1993 July. Included in this set of data are labour force by industry and occupation, class of worker, income, mobility, ethnic origin, home language, religion, level of education and dwelling characteristics.

2.0 DATA RESULTS

Appendix 1 of this report provides the information presently available for the City as whole, and as well for the Greater Vancouver Regional District for comparative purposes.

Burnaby's total population at the time of the 1991 June Census was 158,860; an increase of 9.4 percent from the 1986 population of 145,161. During the same five year period, the GVRD as a whole had a population increase of 15.4 percent. Given the relatively slower population growth in Burnaby, its percentage share of the total regional population decreased from 10.9 percent in 1986 to 10.3 percent in 1991.

Generally speaking, Burnaby's population is older than that of the region. Burnaby's 20 year old and under population was 21.4 percent in 1991 compared to 24.5 percent for the region as a whole. 13.9 percent of Burnaby's population was aged 65 years and older in 1991, compared with 12.3 percent for the region.

The City has become increasingly multicultural when compared to 1986. In 1986, 78.1 percent of the respondents indicated English as their mother tongue. In 1991, this figure had declined to 68.2 percent, with the largest relative increase in Chinese (from 4.6 percent in 1986 to 9.2 percent in 1991). For comparative purposes, the English as mother tongue component for the GVRD was 71.2 percent in 1991.

In terms of the City's dwelling unit inventory, there was a net increase of 4,455 private, occupied units from 1986 to 1991 for an increase of 7.6 percent. The region had a corresponding increase of 10.6 percent. The proportion of private dwellings owned/rented remained virtually unchanged in Burnaby over the 5 year period (51.5 percent of the private dwellings in Burnaby were owned as of 1991 June).

The total number of census families in Burnaby increased by 2,615 from 1986 to 1991, an increase of 6.7 percent. The increase in the GVRD for the same period was 11.4 percent. Burnaby's proportion of lone-parent families declined from 13.2 percent in 1986 to 12.8 percent in 1991.


3.0 CONCLUSION

The results of the 1991 Census for the City as a whole do not contain any startling results. In comparison with the region as a whole, our population growth rate is less. The population is also becoming somewhat older and more multi-cultural.

Staff will soon be receiving similar information on a sub-area basis and will be reviewing resulting trends in the different geographic areas of the City.

A more complete review of the 1991 Census results will be provided to Council once the comprehensive results related to the cultural and economic criteria are released in 1993 July.

These initial results from the 1991 Census are provided for the information of Council.
