a) Ms. Diana Scott, Chairman, Faith Church Nursery School appeared before Council to discuss the provision of a privately run, church-owned non-profit nursery school on Lot 116 of Parkcrest School.

Councillor Redman entered the Council Chamber at 7:25 p.m. and took her place at the Council table.

The speaker advised that the nursery school provides an opportunity for children to explore their future elementary school in a safe, non-threatening environment. Operators at the nursery school have established a good rapport with the Parkcrest teachers and principal. The nursery school has agreed to enhance the site with School Board approved landscaping. The current zoning for the proposed use is appropriate. The Planning Department have also had input into the site plan.

The speaker advised that the school provides two - 2 hour clases per day with 20 children in each class. The school will be 70 feet from the nearest residential property line, a 6 ft. screening hedge will be constructed in accordance with current zoning requirements and all outside play is supervised.

Ms. Scott presented a survey to Council which consisted of 67 signatures of neighbourhood residents expressing support for the nursery school. The speaker concluded by requesting Council's support for development of the nursery school.

# 7. The Faith Church Nursery School Location at Parkcrest Elementary School

The City Manager submitted a report from the Acting Director Planning and Building advising Council that the Faith Church Nursery School has existed in a classroom at Parkcrest Elementary School for several years. Recently the School Board Informed them that the space they currently occupy will be needed by the school. As a result, the operators of the nursery school have been exploring the use of a temporary building on site to house the use, in a manner similar to numerous other instances on school sites throughout the city.

In late March, some of the residents of the area to the north and northeast of the school site have indicated their objections to the placement of a portable to house the nursery school on the school site.

However, an application has not yet been received from the Faith Church Nursery School to locate the portable on the school site.

The concerns expressed by area residents will be taken into consideration should an application be submitted. It is the intent of staff to work with the applicant, should an application be received, to achieve a siting of the proposed facility that is both practical for the school and considerate to the concerns expressed by local residents.
