His Worship, Mayor W.J. Copeland proclaimed the week of 1993 February 22 to 26 as Multicultural Week in Burnaby.

Mayor Copeland then advised those present that tragedy was averted in the early hours of Sunday, February 21 as fire caused the evacuation of the residents of Orchard Park Apartments. The residents were evacuated to Bonsor Recreation Centre where they were fed breakfast and allowed to rest pending return to the apartment building. Nine residents lost all their possessions and were provided lodgings at the Burnaby Villa Hotel. There were no injuries resulting from the three alarm blaze. The Fire Department expressed appreciation to all the emergency response services who attended the scene and assisted the apartment residents.

11. Tree Protection Bylaw

The City Manager submitted a report from the Acting Director Planning and Building prepared in response to concerns raised in correspondence from Ms. Syberg-Olsen pertaining to a proposed tree protection bylaw. Staff advised that authority for enactment of a tree protection bylaw exists in amendments to the Municipal Act which provides authority to pass bylaws to regulate the cutting of trees on private property, including provisions of issuance of tree cutting permits, replacement of trees removed and enforcement action for bylaw offences. The cost for any initiative to control tree cutting, if such is ultimately recommended, would be addressed in future reports for Council's consideration prior to a decision taken on the matter.

2. GVRD Compost Demonstration Garden Agreement

The City Manager submitted a report from the Director Engineering requesting Council's approval to renew the existing agreement with the GVRD for the operation of the Compost Demonstration Garden on Still Creek Avenue. The garden has over 11,800 recorded visitors and conducted 88 workshops for the public since its inception in 1990. The garden has provided an effective means of promoting municipal solid waste reduction through composting in conjunction with other Burnaby waste reduction initiatives and programs. The GVRD intends to continue the operation of the garden in accordance with the terms of the original agreement.

- b) The Greater Vancouver Regional District;
- c) The Provincial Ministry of Environment;
- d) Environmental Protection Agencies (private and non-profit)."

3. Edmonds Area Child Care Centre  
6786 South Point Drive, Burnaby

The City Manager submitted a report from the City Solicitor requesting Council's authority to enter into an agreement with the Province of British Columbia for a \$346,260.00 grant to build a childcare centre at 6786 South Point Drive, Burnaby. The subject lands were transferred to the City of Burnaby from B.C. Hydro as part of the development approval for the adjacent B.C. Hydro headquarters lands and for the purpose of establishing a childcare centre. B.C. Hydro also provided Burnaby with a \$250,000.00 payment toward the cost of building a childcare centre on the lands. The Province of British Columbia has now agreed to provide Burnaby with a grant from the Ministry of Women's Equality, Child Care Branch, Facilities and Equipment Grant Program. The agreement which is the subject of this report is to ensure that the grant funds go towards the cost of establishing the childcare centre. The agreement would require Burnaby to repay the grant if Burnaby ceased to use the lands as a childcare centre within ten years from the date of completion of the centre.

The City Manager recommended:

1. THAT Council authorize the execution of an agreement with the Province of British Columbia for a \$346,260.00 grant to assist in the construction and set-up of a childcare centre at 6786 Southpoint Drive, Burnaby.

9. Reconfiguration of 400 Block MacDonald Avenue  
(Pender Street to Hastings Street)  
Hastings Street Area Plan  
X-Ref. Rezoning Reference #18/92

The City Manager submitted a report from the Acting Director Planning and Building advising Council about developing MacDonald Avenue between Hastings Street and Pender Street for two-way traffic. Staff advised that to develop MacDonald Avenue for two-way traffic, it would be most effective to reconfigure the street to have all the on-street ninety degree parking along the east side.

Although this would result in a net loss of about two parking stalls, the reconfiguration would provide clear and easy access to the parking facility across the street especially off Hastings Street, resulting in a simplified circulation pattern without traffic weaving as at present, and would assure consistency with the proposed configuration for additional side street parking as part of the mitigation measures for the proposed rush hour removal of parking on Hastings Street. The option of angle parking was also considered, but owing to the further significant loss of parking spaces, it has not been recommended. A layout of sixty degree angle parking would produce a maximum of about 16 spaces compared with the 22 existing spaces and the 20 spaces achieved through the reconfiguration being recommended.

The City Manager recommended:

1. THAT staff be authorized to redesign MacDonald Avenue between Hastings Street and Pender Street to allow for two-way traffic while still maximizing the amount of on-street parking.

The proposed retail beer and wine store is interim in that in a future phase of development which entails retail mall development and the demolition of the hotel, a new beer and wine store is proposed to be located in a specified area within the retail mall.

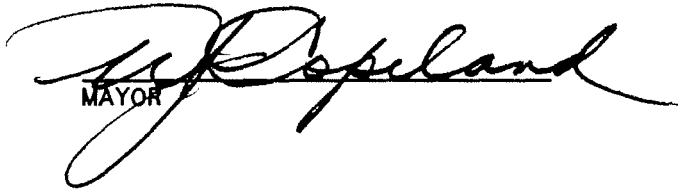
