AGE RESTRICTIONS IN POOL/BILLIARD HALLS AND AMUSEMENT

ARCADES

PURPOSE:

To provide Council with information pertaining to age restrictions on entry into

pool/billiard halls and amusement arcades in other municipalities in the Lower

Mainland.

RECOMMENDATION:

1. THAT Council receive this report for information.

REPORT

1.0 INTRODUCTION

At its meeting of 1993 July 26, Council considered a staff report recommending regulating the hours of operation of and the admittance of children under 16 years of age to pool/billiard halls and amusement arcades. Council amended the age level to 18 years and tabled the report, directing staff to report back regarding the age restriction practice in other local municipalities.

This report outlines age restrictions on entry into pool/billiard halls and amusement arcades in other Lower Mainland jurisdictions.

2.0 REGULATION THROUGH AGE RESTRICTIONS

2.1 Pool/Billiard Halls

Of the nine other municipalities surveyed which permit pool/billiard halls, three - Richmond, Port Moody and Coquitlam - have imposed age restrictions on admittance. Richmond prohibits entry to pool halls to persons under 16 years of age, unless accompanied by a parent or guardian. Port Moody also restricts the admittance of persons under 16 years of age, unless accompanied by a parent or guardian, but only before 3 p.m. and after 10 p.m. Coquitlam prohibits admittance to pool halls to anyone under 18 years of age at any time.

2.2 Amusement Arcades

Of the six other municipalities surveyed which permit amusement arcades, three - Richmond, Port Moody and Vancouver - have imposed age restrictions on admittance. Richmond prohibits entry to amusement arcades to persons under 15 years of age, unless accompanied by a parent or guardian, between 9:30 a.m. and 3 p.m., Monday to Friday, and after 9 p.m., Sunday to Thursday, unless such day is a weekday and a school holiday. Like its pool halls, Port Moody restricts admittance of persons under 16 years of age to arcades, unless accompanied by a parent or guardian, before 3 p.m. and after 10 p.m. Vancouver prohibits admittance to amusement arcades to anyone under 18 years of age at any time.

3.0 CONCLUSION

Some other Lower Mainland municipalities impose age restrictions on entry into pool/billiard halls and amusement arcades, as Burnaby is proposing to do. The age level in the restrictions varies, but is most often 16 or 18 years.
