ANNOUNCEMENT

Ms. Louise Baker, Chair of the Burnaby Family Court and Youth Justice Committee did not appear before Council at this time.

PRESENTATION

His Worship, Mayor Copeland introduced Mr. Keith Hughes, attending the Council meeting on behalf of SalvAide to receive a donation to Burnaby's Sister City, El Zapotal. Mr. Forseth expressed his appreciation for the current relationship of mutual cooperation with Burnaby Council and offered his attendance and assistance at local events whenever possible.

Councillor Rankin retired from the Council Chamber at 7:21 p.m.

Mr. Davidowicz reiterated his support for rapid buses and the extension of rapid transit to Lougheed Mall. The speaker reminded Council of promises issued by past governments to extend transit to Lougheed Mall and suggested that a more proactive approach is required in order to meet the objectives of the Transport 2021 Plan.

Councillor Rankin returned to the Council Chamber at 7:24 p.m. and took his place at the Council table.

In concluding, Mr. Davidowicz encouraged dialogue between Burnaby and the City of Vancouver regarding the implementation of ICTS in the Lougheed/Broadway Corridor and recommended that the Traffic and Transportation Committee review the Manager's Report in detail.

Further, the speaker suggested that recommendation No. 4 should be amended to direct that a copy of the report be forwarded to the Vancouver Regional Transit Commission rather than B.C. Transit staff.

1. Regional ICTS Studies Evaluation of Corridors and Technologies

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The City Manager submitted a report from the Director Planning and Building advising of an approach to respond to the Regional ICTS Studies undertaken by the Crown Corporation's Secretariat and B.C. Transit. The report advises that as a result of the conclusions from the Regional Manager, one of the primary recommendations of the report is that the Strategic Planning Committee recommend that the G.V.R.D. advise the premier that "analysis of the (B.C. Transit) studies suggests that the Board remain with its decision of December 9, 1994 that the New Westminster - Coquitlam rapid transit line should be the first of three lines to be constructed in the medium term in order to meet the Board's growth management and transportation objectives". Staff indicate that the City of Burnaby finds this recommendation not supportable and somewhat perplexing in view of the B.C. Transit Studies. The results of the B.C. Transit report clearly demonstrate the superior ridership, cost effectiveness and intensity of use characteristics of the Lougheed/Broadway line.

In view of this information, it is the position of the City that there is a need for a more comprehensive review of the ICTS Studies and their relationship to the Livable Region Strategy, including a recommended phasing strategy, to be coordinated by the Regional Administrative Advisory Committee with the involvement of B.C. Transit, prior to any position being adopted by the G.V.R.D. Board in respect of the studies.

The City Manager recommended:

- 1. THAT Council advise the Greater Vancouver Regional District Board of the need for a more comprehensive review of the ICTS studies and their relationship to the Livable Region Strategy, including an updating phasing strategy based on this review, to be coordinated by the Regional Administrative Advisory Committee with the involvement of BC Transit, prior to any position being taken by the GVRD Board in respect of the studies.
- 2. THAT Council initiate discussions leading to a continuing dialogue with the City of Vancouver with regard to the implementation of ICTS in the Lougheed/Broadway Corridor.
- 3. THAT a copy of this report be forwarded to Mayor G. Halsey-Brandt, Chair, GVRD Board of Directors.
- 4. THAT a copy of this report be forwarded to the Honourable G. Clark, Minister of Employment and Investment and Mr. G. Leicester, General Manager, Long Range Planning, B.C. Transit.

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The Community Issues and Social Planning Committee submitted a report conveying the results of the Service Equity Project. The key objective of the project was to consult with Burnaby residents of various ethnic backgrounds to collect information on perceived barriers to obtaining City services and to develop specific recommendations to improve the delivery of services to Burnaby residents. Based on the information received from the consultation sessions over 50 recommendations were provided covering broad policy issues to specific actions, service or programs. The recommendations cover a range of topic areas including access to services, cross-cultural competence, systemic barriers, employment equity, inclusiveness, multiculturalism and ethno-cultural community relations.

The Community Issues and Social Planning Committee recommended:

approved the location, design and size of the third ice arena. It is proposed that the third ice arena be located immediately north of Burnaby Lake Arena which provides the opportunity to develop a twinned facility with a common entrance to both the existing and proposed new ice surfaces. The current plan calls for 1,050 seats but staff advise that the Citizen Arena Design Advisory Committee had a clear preference for 2,000 seats as it would allow various organizations to host regional, provincial and national calibre competitions. A firm decision on this issue has not been made to date because reviews have been taking place around concern for the added capital cost. The net cost of the third arena project to the City is estimated at \$9,176,960 and will be reflected in the Five Year Capital Program.

The City Manager recommended:

- 1. THAT the new ice arena project proceed at a location north of the existing arena.
- 2. THAT the design accommodate 2,000 seats and building components as detailed in this report.
- 3. THAT the current client architect agreement with Carlberg Jackson Partners be amended to reflect recommendations #1 and #2, and that the consultants be instructed to immediately proceed with design work.
- 4. THAT the Five Year Capital Plan be amended at Annual Budget to reflect these changes.
- 5. THAT staff be directed to prepare as soon as possible the refined estimates for the changes.

Staff advise that the total cost of the bridge and other cost sharable items would be approximately \$2,291,000, which would be paid to the Province only upon completion of the project.
