- a) **Rob De Lazzari**, 7168 Ridgeview Drive, Burnaby appeared before Council to discuss the Hastings Street Dalla Tina turn-off design which forms part of the overall Hastings/Gaglardi Connector.

Councillor Redman arrived at the Council meeting at 7:08 p.m. and took her place at the Council table.

Mr. De Lazzari advised Council that not everyone in the immediate neighbourhood supported the extension of Dalla Tina Drive but rather support the original proposal of the Ministry of Transportation and Highways which offers a safe route and complies with all necessary requirements. Mr. Dalla Tina expressed concern regarding the many staff resources utilized in support of Mr. Dalla Tina's proposal and objected to the additional costs which would be borne by the City should Council agree to the extension of Dalla Tina Drive. In concluding, the speaker respectfully urged Council to support the original modified design and support the Manager's report which appears on this evening's Council agenda.

- b) **Mr. Dino Sartori**, 7311 Hastings Street, Burnaby appeared before Council to speak in favour of Proposal B for the extension of Dalla Tina Drive. Mr. Sartori refuted the position as presented by Mr. Rob De Lazzari and provided information in support of the proposal outlined by Mr. Dalla Tina. The speaker contended that the individuals who signed the petitions circulated by Mr. De Lazzari are not affected by the proposal. Mr. Sartori suggested that Plan A creates a 'T' intersection which will create a safety hazard to cyclists, pedestrians and motorists. In concluding, the speaker requested Council to focus on the area where residents are most directly affected by the road design.

Mr. Arrigo Dalla Tina, 7321 Hastings Street, Burnaby appeared before Council to inquire why the Option B design requires a sidewalk whereas Option A does not. Mr. Dalla Tina further inquired as to the requirement for a 24 ft. pavement for a one-way road and why a clear 50 ft. right-of-way is required. Mr. Dalla Tina concluded by requesting Council to make the right decision in the interest of public safety.

In view of the absence of Councillor Evans from the meeting, Councillor Young was granted leave to introduce the following motion:

2. Animal Control - S.P.C.A. Contract

The City Manager submitted a report from the Director Finance seeking approval for the 1995 SPCA Contract and a multi-year contract covering 1996, 1997 and 1998. The 1995 contract proposal would see the overall costs of animal control services increased by 0.07% which reflects actual operating costs of the SPCA and inflation. The proposal will increase the cost of pound keeping contract by \$428

or 0.12% in 1995. Staff advised that funds were included in the 1995 Annual Budget for the 1995 contract.

The City Manager recommended:

1. THAT the contract with the S.P.C.A. be approved for the period 1995 January 01 to 1995 December 31 at a cost of \$354,836, plus 35 % commission on dog licences sold through the S.P.C.A.; and
2. THAT the contract with the S.P.C.A. be renewed for 1996, 1997 and 1998 at a cost to the City which would increase according to the Vancouver Consumer Price Index for the previous year, plus 35 % commission of dog licences sold each year through the S.P.C.A.

3. Collection Services Agreement - Parking Ticket Violations

In 1995 August, Council adopted a report recommending a number of changes related to the RCMP Parking Enforcement System. One of the changes was a recommendation to contract for the services of a collection agency. As a result of advertising in the Vancouver Sun on 1995 October 21, ten proposals were received and evaluated. Staff advised that the proposal submitted by Nor-Don Collection Network Incorporated meets all of the City's requirements and provides the highest collection recoveries, estimated to be approximately \$207,000 per year.

1. Barnet - Hastings People Moving Project:
Dalla Tina Avenue Extension

The City Manager submitted a report from the Director Planning and Building updating Council on the current status of the Dalla Tina Extension and providing a review of the petition submitted by Mr. Dalla Tina and Mr. De Lazzari regarding the proposed extension of Dalla Tina Avenue to the Burnaby Mountain Parkway. Staff advised that upon receipt of a petition submitted by Mr. De Lazzari, Council requested that staff identify discrepancies on the petition and conduct a telephone survey of the neighbourhoods where any discrepancies were evident. In response, staff have identified persons signing both petitions, surveyed the opinions of these persons and developed a revised count of signatures on both petitions.

Based on the evaluation of the design, environmental cost in property implications of the Dalla Tina Extension as presented in previous reports to Council, staff would recommend that Council support the modified original access road as described in the tabled City Manager's Report No. 41, 1995 September 11. The review of the two petitions confirms that most residents of the Ridgeview Neighbourhood support the original design.

The City Manager recommended:

1. THAT Council request the Ministry of Transportation and Highways to modify the design of the access road as outlined in Section 3 (iii) of the tabled City Manager's Report No. 41 of September 11.
